BUCKS COUNTY AREA LITERATURE SUB-COMMITTEE REPORT SEPT.1988

Financial Report-

We had a balance last month of \$382.67. This month I purchased \$430.24 worth of literature. We now have a balance of \$812.91. Although last month our literature sales totaled \$571.76, I have not yet turned this money over to the region because last month I had turned over all funds collected to the area; however due to problems with our area bank account, even though the money was deposited, as I understand it, our area treasurer does not have access to the account since the former treasurer's name is still on the account. I see this as a serious problem that demands immediate attention. Due to the fact that the regional literature person received the order from the W.S.O. a few days ago, as of this writing I have not yet received the order. He was making arrangements to make sure we had it in time for the area service meeting.

MOTIONS-

The region is lowering the price of two items. White books are going to be \$0.40 and key tags will be \$0.25. It has been suggested to me that maybe we should raise our prices to help reduce the balance we have with the region. So, I decided to put it in the form of a motion to see how the rest of the area feels about this. Every other area in the region charges \$10.00 for a basic Text.

I would suggest the following prices:

Basic text \$10.00 White books \$0.50 key tags \$0.35

Also I would suggest, for simplicy, to no longer have the groups individualy pay the shipping, since these prices would also help offset those costs.

POLICY-

The policy of having the groups call in their literature orders seems to going well. Many groups have called their orders in and hopefully next month more will do the same.
