How could we recover? There is much graditude in my life today. Because of these principles I have, fellow recovering addicts in my life who unconditionaly reach out, share empthy, love, and understanding unite us. Today, I give thanks to God for caring, directing, and showing me that I could live a better life through a program called Narcotics Anonymous. It was suggested to me that I follow certain principles in the program such as the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions, things would get better. Thank

God , and they have.

This is not a "I" program, but a "WE" program. We admitted, came to believe, and made a decision to turn our lives over to God through the fellowship. These are the principles that open the door to our recovery. First, we had to look at ourselves and to admit that we were addicts and had a problem and that our lives were a mess. Second, we believe that no one except our Higher Power (God) could carry us to where we are a day at a time. Third, we make a decision to turn our pain, hurt, and shame over to God. However, to let him do his will and not our's.

On the other hand, the principles, especially the first three, said we were addicts, we could change, and we can recover, if we apply

However, if we continue through the Steps and Traditions, which is a must, we will become productive and responsible recovering individual and feel good about ourselves. in order to recover.

"We" are a family who works together in order to stay together. However, let us use the principles in all of our affairs and remember Principles before Personalities and life itself.

Remember we have a family bond, and thank you God for saving me.

The principles of unity can be found in the Basic Text. "True spiritual principles are never in conflict: they complement each other." Four of these are surrender, humility, service and anonymity. I'd like to share my experience on these along with other quotes from our literature.

"Surrender meand not having to fight anymore." Every Step and Tradition begins with surrender. The principle of freedom from active addiction is to cease resistance to change. Wherever there is resistance unity cannot survive.

Unity begins with surrender.

Humility is the foundation of all the Twelve Steps of N.A. "Humility is as much a part of staying clean as food and water are to staying alive." I accept my disease as it is. I am willing to be influencen by the powers that surround me. I make every effort not to be a fraud and allow you to see me as I really am. Humility is the ability to love and to be loved unconditionaly.

"Service is a power greater than we, and has significant meaning for all" (I.P. 5- Another Look). By surrendering my personal desires and wading into service work, my isolation is penetrated with a new purpose in life. I have

experienced the pain of active addiction and the rewards of recovery. I have a message to carry.

Anonymity is surrendering the "I" for "We". "It protects us from our own defects of character and renders personalities and their differences <u>powerless</u>." I try not to think about what is best for N.A. My selfcenteredness works through my defects of character focusing on pride and prestige. I am not a unique addict. "By working together for our common welfare, we achieve the true spirit of anonymity."

When birds fly south to avoid the cold, winter months, they fly in a "V" shape or as a UNIT. It doesn't matter if any bird flies with family, friend, or foe. No bird could fly the southerly direction alone and suvive. "Self

sufficiency is a lie."

"Our survival is directly related to the survival of the group and the Fellowship." I am an addict headed in the same direction as you: recovery. I surrender to the support of N.A. I strive to build a harmonious relationship with God, myself and other human beings. I'm one part of a UNIT of a greater whole called N.A.

Through principles we unite. "I CAN'T, WE CAN"

Thank you, Cleansheet for picking the topic "Through Principles We Unite". It is rather timely, considering the 8th GPRONA has this slopan for it's theme.

Many times I've heard the saying "There are no musts in NA, but every NA group ought to be fully-self supporting declining outside contributions". How surprised I became when someone told me there were 13 musts! It's true, too there are 13 "musts" in the steps portion alone. Actually there are at least 34 musts in book one and 2 in the introduction. I would like to merely quote 5 that can be found in the 1st & 2nd Traditions. (Yes-in the 5th edition that's pp. 60-61. In the 3rd that's pp. 58-59.)

"Unity is a must in Narcotics Anonymous."

"We must live and work together as a group to ensure that in a storm our ship does not sink and our members do not perish."

"We must be constantly on guard that our decision are truly an expression of God's will."

"An atmosphere of recovery in our groups is one of our most valued assets, and we <u>must</u> guard it carefully, lest we lose it to politics and personalities."

"We must remember that offices have been placed in trust, that we are trusted servants, and that at no time do any of us govern."

Also from the introduction; (p.xvi)

"We <u>must</u> always remember that as individual members, groups, and service committees, we are not and should never be in competition with each other."

Our recovery is dependant on the strenght and unity of our Fellowship. The above 6 quotes say all that is necessary.

They can be found in the Basic Text. They can be found in the Traditions. They can be found in the Spiritual Principles of the program. Hopefully, they will always be found in the WorldWide Fellowship. And I pray that they will be found in us

I was determined and deliberate about this, I was tired of suffering. When I had called for help that first day, he had asked me 'Are you willing to go to any lenghts not to have to feel this way any more?' Immediately I bellowed YES, YES, anything, please help me. Since that day I have worked very hard on my recovery. Granted, not always becouse I wanted to, but sometimes because I was forced to by how I was feeling and what I was thinking.

As time passed I began to understand the STEPS and accept them. One by one I worked at applying them to my life. (with the help fo my sponsor, the fellowship, and my Higher Power) Each step has been a learning & growing experience. Don't get me wrong, just because I did these steps doesn't mean that I was through with them. It has taken many years to be happy and comfortable with myself and others, due to taking each and every step several times and working through my own insecurities and self-centeredness. TODAY I am very

comfortable in my recovery.

Going to meetings, still after 10 years, is a great benefit. I once heard, "Where can I better help the addict who still suffers than in an N.A. meeting." My Higher Power is my major source of strength. Sponsorship is very important, without it I would not be where I am today.
