

Directions to Wyndham Franklin Plaza

From I-95 North or South (Phila. Int'l Airport, Wash.,DC)

Follow I-95 to exit 17 (the "676 WEST/CENTRAL PHILADELPHIA" exit). When you get off at that exit follow 676 west to the first exit which is "Broad Street". When you get off at that exit it will merge you onto 15th Street. The first light that you reach is Vine Street. You will then make a right and proceed two blocks to 17th Street and you will make a left. The Hotel is 1 1/2 blocks on your left.

From PA Turnpike West of Philadelphia

Take the turnpike to exit 24 which is the "Valley Forge" exit. When you get off at that exit, take Rt. 76 East to exit 38 which is "676 EAST/CENTRAL PHILADELPHIA" exit. When you get off at that exit stay in the right hand lane and follow the signs for "Broad Street/Central Philadelphia". When you exit the first light is 15th Street. You will then go two blocks to Cherry Street. You will then make a right onto Cherry Street. You will then go one block to 16th Street and make a right. Go 1 1/2 blocks. The Hotel will be on your left.

From the East - NY, NJ

Take the NJ Turnpike to exit 4. When you get off exit 4 you will then take Rt. 73 North to Rt. 38 West. Rt. 38 West will merge into Rt. 30 West. Route 30 West will take you to and over the Benjamin Franklin Bridge. Once you are over the bridge you will merge into Vine Street. Stay in the lanes that are under the sign that reads "611/VINE STREET LOCAL TRAFFIC". Follow Vine Street to 17th

Street. There you will make a left onto 17th Street. Go 1 1/2 blocks the Hotel is on your left.

To Philadelphia International Airport

When you exit from the garage you will be facing 16th Street. You will make a left onto 16th Street. The first light that you reach is Vine Street, make a right and stay to your left, follow the signs for "676 EAST" and "95 SOUTH". Take 1-95 South to Philadelphia International Airport

The 12 Steps Of N.A.

- We admitted that we were powerless over our addiction, that our lives had become unmanageable.
- We came to believe that a power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
- We made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.
- 4. We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- We admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- 6. We were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
- We humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
- We made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
- We made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
- We continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.
- We sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for the knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
- Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to addicts, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

The 12 Traditions of N.A.

- Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends on N.A. unity.
- For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern.
- 3. The only requirement for membership is the desire to stop using.
- Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups and N.A. as a whole.
- Each group has but one primary purpose to carry the message to the addict who still suffers.
- An N.A. group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the N.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property or prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
- Every N.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.
- Narcotics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.
- N.A., as such, ought never be organized, but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.
- Narcotics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the N.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
- Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.
- Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

e would like to welcome you to the 11th Greater Philadelphia Regional Convention of Narcotics Anonymous. Our theme this year is: "THE BROADER THE BASE, THE HIGHER THE POINT OF FREEDOM". It is derived from our symbol in the Basic Text, which tells us that the base (Goodwill doing the right thing for the right reasons) and the four pyramid sides (Self, Society, Service and God) all rise to the point of FREEDOM*. The freedoms that our literature talks about are: Freedom from Active Addiction, Freedom to Recover, Freedom of Choice, Freedom to Change, Freedom to Trust, Freedom from the Past, Freedom to Live in the Present, and Freedom from Defects and Shortcomings. These freedoms are achieved by actively participating in the unity expressed in our first Tradition - becoming and staying a part of. It is in the spirit of this unity that we invite you to share with us in this celebration of recovery.

Anonymity Statement

N.A.'s 11th Tradition reads: "Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films." We ask that everyone attending respect our members' anonymity by not using full face photographs, last names, or personal details when describing this meeting to others.

Suggestions

- 1) Reach out and hug each other.
- Allow the flow of recovery to come into you. Go with the flow, and become a vital part of fellowship.
- 3) Reach out to as many of your friends in recovery as possible, especially the ones you haven't met yet. Get their names, addresses, and phone numbers and use them when you get home after the convention.
- Make an effort to get to a service workshop and learn about the spiritual principles in service work.
- Carry the message to the addict still suffering.

In Narcotics Anonymous, we are presented with a dilemma. When N.A. members identify themselves as "addicts and alcoholics", "cross-addicted", or talk about living "clean and sober", the clarity of the N.A. message is blurred. To speak in this manner suggests that there are two diseases; that one drug is separate from the rest. Narcotics Anonymous makes no distinction between drugs. Our identification as addicts is all-inclusive, allowing us to concentrate on similarities, not differences.

The above statement is offered in the spirit of N.A. unity. Please remember this request is not made in order to rule, censor, or dictate behavior. We make this request to help provide an atmosphere of recovery, where we can hear the simple, unconfusing, and lifesaving message of Narcotics Anonymous.



The 12 Concepts of N.A. Service

- To fulfill our fellowship's primary purpose, the N.A. groups have joined together to create a structure which develops, coordinates, and maintains services on behalf of N.A. as a whole.
- The final responsibility and authority for N.A. services rests with the N.A. groups.
- The N.A. groups delegate to the service structure the authority necessary to fulfill the responsibilities assigned to it.
- Effective leadership is highly valued in Narcotics Anonymous. Leadership qualities should be carefully considered when selecting trusted servants.
- For each responsibility assigned to the service structure, a single point of decision and accountability should be clearly defined.
- Group conscience is the spiritual means by which we invite a loving God to influence our decisions
- All members of a service body bear substantial responsibility for that body's decisions and should be allowed to fully participate in its decision-making process.
- Our service structure depends on the integrity and effectiveness of our communications
- All elements of our service structure have the responsibility to carefully consider all viewpoints in their decision-making processes.
- Any member of a service body can petition that body for the redress of a personal grievance, without fear of reprisal.
- N.A. funds are to be used to further our primary purpose, and must be managed responsibly.
- In keeping with the spiritual nature of Narcotics Anonymous, our structure should always be one of service, never of government.

- Just for today my thoughts will be on my recovery, living and enjoying life without the use of drugs.
- Just for today I will have faith in someone in N.A. who believes in me and wants to help me in my recovery.
- Just for Today I will have a program. I will try to follow it to the best of my ability.
- Just for today through N.A. I will try get a better perspective on my life.
- Just for today I will be unafraid, my thoughts will be on my new associations, people who are not using and who have found a new way of life. So long as I follow that way, I have nothing to fear.
