

Tell Yourself

Just For Today, my thoughts will be on my recovery, living and enjoying my life without the use of drugs.

Just For Today, I will have faith in someone in N.A. who believes in me and wants to help me in my recovery.

Just For Today, I will have a program. I will try to follow it to the best of my ability.

Just For Today, Through N.A. I will try to get a better perspective on my life.

Just For Today, I will be unafraid, my thoughts will be on my new associations, people who are not using and who have found a new way of life. So long as I follow that way, I have nothing to fear.

...TWELVE STEPS...

- We admitted that we were powerless over our addiction, that our lives had become unmanageable.
- We came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
- We made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.
- We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- We admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- We were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
- We humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
- We made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
- We made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
- We continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.
- 11. We sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we

- understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
- 12. Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry out this message to addicts, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

...TWELVE TRADITIONS...

- Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends on NA unity.
- For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern.
- The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using.
- Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or NA as a whole.
- Each group has but one primary purpose—to carry the message to the addict who still suffers.
- An NA group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the NA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property or prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
- Every NA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.
- Narcotics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.
- 9. NA, as such, ought never be organized, but we

- may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.
- Narcotics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the NA name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
- Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.
- Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

In order to make this a memorable occasion, we suggest the following:

- Carry the message to the addict who still suffers.

CLARITY STATEMENT

In Narcotics Anonymous, we are presented with a dilemma. When N.A. members identify themselves as "addicts and alcoholics," "cross-addicted," or talk about living "clean and sober," the clarity of the N.A. message is blurred. To speak in this manner suggests that there are two diseases; that one drug is separate from the rest. Narcotics Anonymous makes no distinction between drugs. Our identification as addicts is all-inclusive, allowing us to concentrate on similarities, not differences.

This statement is offered in the spirit of N.A. unity. Please remember this request is not made in order to rule, censor, or dictate behavior. We make this request to help provide an atmosphere of recovery, where we can hear the simple, unconfusing, and lifesaving message of Narcotics Anonymous.




- To fulfill our fellowship's primary purpose, the NA groups have joined together to create a structure which develops, coordinates, and maintains services on behalf of NA as a whole.
- The final responsibility and authority for NA services rests with the NA groups.
- The NA groups delegate to the service structure the authority necessary to fulfill the responsibilities assigned to it.
- Effective leadership is highly valued in Narcotics Anonymous. Leadership qualities should be carefully considered when selecting trusted servants.
- For each responsibility assigned to the service structure, a single point of decision and accountability should be clearly defined.
- Group conscience is the spiritual means by which we invite a loving God to influence our decisions.
- All members of a service body bear substantial responsibility for that body's decisions and should be allowed to fully participate in its decisionmaking processes.

- Our service structure depends on the integrity and effectiveness of our communications.
- All elements of our service structure have the responsibility to carefully consider all viewpoints in their decision-making processes.
- Any member of a service body can petition that body for the redress of a personal grievance, without fear of reprisal.
- NA funds are to be used to further our primary purpose, and must be managed responsibly.
- In keeping with the spiritual nature of Narcotics Anonymous, our structure should always be one of service, never of government.



New Jersey Turnpike South to Exit #4. Follow signs to Route 73 North, to Route 38 West, to Route 30 North (Admiral Wilson Boulevard), to Benjamin Franklin Bridge/Philadelphia. Follow the signs for local traffic (this is Vine Street). Go approximately 6 blocks, make a left turn onto 12th Street. Go to the 2nd traffic light which is Race Street. The Convention Center begins at Race Street (next light).

FROM THE PENNSYLVANIA TURNPIKE

Follow Pennsylvania Turnpike to Exit 25A/I-476. Take I-476 South to Exit 6/I-76 Philadelphia. Stay on I-76 East for for approximately 12 miles. Exit at #38/Route 676 East. Take 676 East and exit at Broad Street/Route 611 (2nd exit, stay in middle lane). You will be on Vine Street. Follow Vine Street to 12th Street (4 traffic lights). Make a right onto 12th Street and the Convention Center begins at Race Street (next light).

FROM 1-95 SOUTH

Take I-95 South to Exit 17 Central Philadelphia/Route 676. Stay in the left lane of this exit. Follow signs for 676 West to the 1st exit (Broad Street). This exit brings you up to 15th and Vine Streets. At the 2nd traffic light (Vine Street East) make a left turn. The 3rd traffic light is 12th Street. Make a right onto 12th Street and the Convention Center begins at Race Street (next light).

FROM PHILADELPHIA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (I-95 NORTH), BALTIMORE, WASHINGTON AND DELAWARE

Take I-95 North to Exit 17 Central Philadelphia/Route 676. Follow signs for 676 West to the 1st exit (Broad Street). This exit brings you up to 15th and Vine Streets. At the 2nd traffic light (Vine Street East) make a left turn. The 3rd traffic light is 12th Street. Make a right onto 12th Street and the Convention Center begins at Race Street (next light).
