


Driving Directions:

From the airport and points South of Philadelphia. Take I-95, to I-76 W (adjacent to airport) follow I-76W for about 20 miles to exit 26A US 202 N to King of Prussia. Go North for about 0.2 miles, turn right onto US 202 (Dekalb Pike) and go East for about 200 ft, bear left and go Northeast for about 500 ft. Continue on Gulph Road, Northwest for about 1.8 miles. Turn right onto First Avenue.

From points North: Take I-95 to I-76W (after the Girard Ave Exit adjacent to center city) follow I-76W for about 20 miles to exit 26A US 202 N to King of Prussia. Go North for about 0.2 miles, turn right onto US 202 (Dekalb Pike) and go East for about 200 ft, bear left and go Northeast for about 500 ft. Continue on Gulph Road, Northwest for about 1.8 miles. Turn right onto First Avenue.

From points West: Take exit 18 off of I-376onto I-76 Pennsylvania Turnpike, bear right onto I-76 and go East for about 270 miles. Take exit 24 off of the turnpike (Philadelphia, Valley Forge, Rt 202 and I 476) you will still be on I-76. Continue on to exit 25, Valley Forge. Bear right after exiting on exit 25 onto PA 363/Gulph Road. Continue on Gulph Road for 1 mile, turn on to First Ave.

From points East: Take I-676W/Rt30 to I-76W. Follow I-76W for about 20 miles to exit 26A US 202 N to King of Prussia. Go North for about 0.2 miles, turn right onto US 202 (Dekalb Pike) and go East for about 200 ft, bear left and go Northeast for about 500 ft. Continue on Gulph Road, Northwest for about 1.8 miles. Turn right onto First Avenue.



CLARITY STATEMENT

In Narcotics Anonymous, we are presented with a dilemma When N.A. members identify themselves as "addicts and alcoholics", "cross-addicted", or talk about living "clean and sober", the clarity of the N.A. message is blurred. To speak in this manner suggests that there are two diseases; that one drug is separate from the rest. Narcotics Anonymous makes no distinction between drugs. Our identification as addicts is all-inclusive, allowing us to concentrate on similarities, not differences.



CONVENTION CENTER MAIN LEVEL



SUGGESTIONS

In order to make this a memorable occasion, we suggest the following:

- *Reach out and hug each other.
- * Allow the flow of recovery to come into you. Go with the flow and become a vital part of this fellowship event.
- *Reach out to as many friends in recovery as possible, especially the ones you haven't met yet. Get their names, addresses, and phone numbers and use them when you get home.
- *Make an effort to get to a service workshop and learn about the spiritual principles in service work.
- *Carry the message to the addict who still suffers.

THE TWELVE STEPS

- 1. We admitted that we were powerless over our addiction, that our lives had become unmanageable.
- 2. We came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
- 3. We made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.
- 4. We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- 5. We admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- 6. We were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
- 7. We humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
- 8. We made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
- 9. We made direct amends to such people where ever possible. except when to do so would injure them or others.
- 10. We continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong, promptly admitted it.
- 11. We sought, though prayer and meditation, to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
- 12. Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to addicts, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

THE TWELVE TRADITIONS

- 1. Our common welfare should come first, personal recovery depends on N.A. unity.
- 2. For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience.

 Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern.
- 3. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using.
- 4. We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- 5. Each group has but one primary purpose to carry the message to the addict who still suffers.
- 6. An N.A. group out never endorse, finance, or lend the N.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property or prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
- 7. Every N.A. group out to be fully self-supporting, declining
- 8. Narcotics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, outside contributions. but our service centers may employ special workers.
- 9. N.A., as such, ought never be organized, but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they
- 10. Narcotics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the N.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
- 11. Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain person anonymity at the level of press, radio and films.
- 12. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

N.A.'s 11th Tradition reads; "Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio and films." We ask that everyone attending this convention respect member's anonymity by not using full face photographs, last names, or personal details when describing this convention to others.

It is our responsibility to inform you that the hotel has it's own security force. Their only purpose is for the hotel's internal security. THE TWELVE CONCEPTS

- L To fall our fellowship's primary purpose, the N.A. groups have joined poster to create a structure which develops, coordinates, and maintains services on behalf of N.A. as a whole.
- 2. The final responsibility and authority for N.A. services rests with the N.A. group.
- 3. The N.A. groups delegate to the service structure, the authority necessary to fulfill the responsibilities assigned to it,
- 4. Effective leadership is highly valued in Narcotics Anonymous. Leadership qualities should be carefully considered when selecting trusted servants.
- 5. For each responsibility assigned to the service structure, a single point of decision and accountability should be clearly defined.
- 6. Group conscience is the spiritual means by which we invite a loving God to influence our decisions.
- 7. All members of a service body bear substantial responsibility for the body's decisions and should be allowed to fully participate in the decision making processes.
- 8. Our service structure depends on the integrity and effectiveness of our communications
- 9. All elements of our service structure have the responsibility to carefully consider all viewpoints in their decision making processes.
- 10. Any member of a service body can petition that body for the redress of a personal grievance, without fear of reprisal.
- 11. N.A. funds are to be used to further our primary purpose, and must be managed responsibly.
- 12. In keeping with the spiritual nature of Narcotics Anonymous, our structure should always be one of service, never of government.


