They all have presence of manner, good clear speaking voices, and a clear-elutcut message of Recovery-via the 12 Steps.

True, none of them are "celebrities" per se, but they carry the message of N.A., and not just a "war story" of how much they used with no hopeful wonclusion of how it works, and therefore how it can work for anyone.

I was very dissappointed to only hear of the Speaker choices THREE days prior to Deadline! What is the hurry with all this deadline? Ideally, the Speaker Committee should be albe to hear a 30 minute tape of what they were like, what happened, and what they are like now, so that we not fall into Personalitys.

I feel a backlash from last years criticism of Speakers, but what you fall to take into consideration is that we "oldtimer" deliberately left it all to the Santa Rosa group to put that convention together, and the most sobriety was probably two years, and very few people stayed with their committees as it came down to the end of the line. But, sik or swim, they did it, the grass-roots per se, the new blood. Well, we learned that Speakers must be committee picked, in a democratic process, not campaigning for certain speakers. The choice should be on principle not personality.

This is the kind of criticism you will continue to get, so long as you choose to leave us out up here. This is directed to MSO there in Los Angeles, but the feding is very strong up here that you (MSO) just do and print whatever you want with no sharing and asking what the group levels up here think about it.

The was I not informed of the Speaker nominees, with time to contribute names from up here?

I strongly oppose this rushing through of the chhosing of Speakers. I oppose that as your Addict Trustee, and as a committed member of Marcotics Anonymous!

Mr. Morena is going to send me the draft of the Program. but not the Speakers, and here, it is this Saturday that you are choosing the Speakers! That is outrageous and an insult to those of us up here who are working so hard with a new structure and formula for N.1. in the future. This kind of stuff and of operations is exactly what has kept N.1. in the back, floundering because we do not permeate an all inclusiveness at the polcy-making decisions level. N.A. should work from the ground-group level up, not the reverse, whether that top is WSO, or ego-trippers individually, of which we have all had our share of doing. Lets let this be a time of change, lets do it different, so what if we make mistakes, at least we will be active, the new young people will grow to have a committment instead of being indoctrianted that so and so will do it, etc.

O' let me stop with this now. As I sit and read what I have written, the majority of this harrange belongs to WSO, and so understand that o.k. I will zerox a copy of this and send it to them too. I have asked for a list of names and addresses of A LL the Trustees for just this purposer, so that everyone will know what the next guy is thinking, doesn't mean that I am right, only that I have the space to say it. right or wrong, and then let Group Conscience decide.




