#### THE TWELVE STEPS OF N.A.

1. We admitted that we were powerless over our addiction, that our lives had become unmanageable.

2. We came to believe that a power greater than ourselves could

restore us to sanity.

- We made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him 4. We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves. 5. We admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being
- the exact nature of our wrongs. 6. We were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects

of character

7. We humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings. 8. We made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.

9. We made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except

when to do so would injure them or others. 10. We continued to take personal inventory, and when we were wrong

promptly admitted it.

11. We sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God, as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us, and the power to carry that out.

12. Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of those steps, we tried to carry this message to addicts and to practice these principles

in all our affairs.

#### THE TWELVE TRADITIONS OF N.A.

1. Our common welfare should come first: personal recovery depends on N.A. unity.

2. For our Group purpose there is but one ultimate authority-- a loving God as He may express Himself in our Group conscious, our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not

The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using

4. Each Group should be autonomous. except in matters affecting other Groups, or N.A., as a whole.

5 Each Group has but one primary purpose—to carry the message to the addict who still suffers

6. An N.A. Group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the N.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money property or prestige divert us from our primary purpose.

7. Every N.A. Group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.

8. Narcotics Anonymous should remain forever non-professional, but our Service Centers

may employ special workers 9. N.A., as such, ought never be organized, but we may create service boards or commit-

tees directly responsible to those they serve.

10 N.A. has no opinion on outside issues; hence the N.A. name ought never be drawn

into public controversy.

11. Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio and films.

12. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our Traditions, ever reminding us to place

principles before personalities.

#### TRAVEL INFORMATION

AIR TRAVEL: Three major airports service the Washington Metropolitan Area.

WASHINGTON NATIONAL AIRPORT is just across the Potomac in Virginia. It is a 3 1/2 mile or 15 minute drive into downtown Washington. Fares to the hotel are: Taxis, approximately \$8-10; Flyer Limousine (meets in front of United Airline Terminal), \$5 one way, \$9 round trip; Subway, approximately \$1-2. The subway is located across the street from the main terminal. Take the yellow line to Gallery Place Station. Change trains to the red line towards Woodley Park-Zoo Station. The Woodley Park-Zoo Station is only a few steps from the Shoreham's main entrance. Outside the station, turn right and walk to the Connecticut Ave/Calvert Street intersection. Take another right and the Shoreham is on the left.

DULLES INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT is about 35 minutes from downtown Washington. Taxi fare, approximately \$35-40; Flyer Limousine service from Dulles meets at the lower level east wing. This service is \$9 and brings you into the D.C. area. Metro bus or taxi will take you to the hotel.

BALTIMORE WASHINGTON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (BWI) is approximately 45 minutes from downtown Washington. Taxi fare, approximately \$50 (agree on price with driver before leaving BWI). Flyer Limousine service will take you to National Airport - once there, you will need to change to another Flyer Limousine that will take you to the Shoreham. Total cost is \$16.

RAIL TRAVEL: Washington is serviced by one train station: Union Station. The subway is located right out front of the station. Take the red line towards Woodley Park-Zoo. (Look under Air Travel for directions to the hotel.)

BUS TRAVEL: Both Greyhound and Trailways bus stations are located in the heart of the city.

PARKING: Parking for registered guests at the Shoreham is \$6.00 a day.
