This booklet of information should help make your planning for the upcoming World Convention in Portland, Oregon easier to accomplish. In addition to the information provided about different companies, you may also get information from the host committee and the World Service Office. The host committee can be reached by phone through this number: (503) 230-1196. When you call the World Service Office for assistance at (818) 780-3951, please ask for Michelle.

HOTELS

For those desiring to stay in hotels, the convention has room price agreements at hotels. As the number of hotel rooms available in each hotel is limited, you may want to make reservations early. The primary events (main meetings, workshops, convention store and registration) will be held at the Memorial Colise-um which is located at 1401 North Wheeler.

Some of the special events (banquets, dances, etc.) will be scheduled for specific hotels. Some workshops will also be held in the Red Lion Lloyd Center Hotel. There will be marathon meetings and hospitality rooms at both the Red Lion Lloyd Center, which is located at 1000 N.E. Multnomah and the Portland Hilton Hotel, which is located at 921 S.W. Sixth Avenue.

There is some distance between most hotels and the Coliseum. You may want to make your selection of hotel for the combination of advantages that suit your attendance at the convention. For example those who may wish to be in the downtown area of the city may elect to choose either the Portland Hilton (3) or the Heathman Hotel (4). Those members who may wish to be closer to the Memorial Coliseum may elect to stay at the Red Lion Lloyd Center (2) or the Best Western Coliseum (5). See the enclosed map for the location of these facilities. The following hotels have agreed to offer these room rates for attendees of this N.A. convention for reservations made prior to August 1, 1990. The hotels reserve the right to charge regular rates for rooms that are reserved after August 1, 1990. Rates quoted do not include tax which is 9% per night. NOTE:

If you need additional help with hotel information, you may call the Portland Oregon Visitors Association Housing Bureau at (503) 279-9799.

The hotels will only hold sleeping rooms until 5:00 p.m. on the day of arrival. Members arriving after this time need to secure the reservation with a credit card or a cash deposit with the hotel.

All rooms available by contract to WCNA are noncommissionable (not available to travel agents) and should be requested only by members attending the convention.

Cancellations of rooms must be made in writing directly with the hotels. Date and name changes must be made directly with the hotels. Failure to notify hotels of late arrival, last minute changes and/or failure to comply with deposit requirements, MAY RESULT IN CANCELLATION of room reservations.

The hotels do not mail reservation confirmations until one month prior to arrival. If you want earlier confirmation, you may telephone the hotel directly to verify your reservation. If you do not receive written confirmation from your selected hotel by 20 days prior to your arrival, call the hotel directly.

REGISTRATION

Those who have pre-registered will be required to present a copy of the invoice that they received during the pre-registration period. 

ALTERNATE STORE

Regions that desire to participate in this Sunday event must submit a written request by August 15, 1990 to the World Convention Corporation c/o WSO. Merchandise that contains representations of the N.A. logo may not be sold in any convention hotel or facility by unauthorized vendors at any time.

SHUTTLE TRANSPORTATION

A convention organized shuttle bus system will be in place beginning at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday and ending on Sunday at 2:00 p.m. You may obtain a bus pass for this option with your registration. There will be two separate bus routes. Buses will run approximately every twenty minutes.

WCNA-20 will provide limited shuttle service for handicapped attendees, providing WCNA is notified prior to August 15, 1990 with name, hotel selected, airline and flight number, date and time of arrival and departure. A schedule will be developed on site to provide for attendance at scheduled events.

The city of Portland operates an extensive public transportation system. It includes modern busses with a moderate cost per ride and a light rail system. The light rail service connects the Memorial Coliseum to many of the hotels. The cost per ride on the light rail is \$0.75.

GROUND TRANSPORTATION

For those desiring to rent a car at the convention in Portland, if you wish to rent a car from Budget or Hertz, you may do so and receive a 5% discount from the normal price.

When you reserve your car from Budget, please notify the ticket agent that you are with the WCNA-20 group. The reservation phone number for Budget is: (800) 772-3773. You may also find Budget Rent-a-Car in the white pages of a local directory.

When reserving your car from Hertz, please use this number 5813. The reservation phone number for Hertz is: (800) 654-2240. You may also find Hertz Rent-a-Car in the white pages of a local directory.

Bus transportation from the airport to major hotels is available for a nominal fee (approximately \$12.00 round trip). The Grey-line Company offers this service. There is also a shuttle service provided on the Ranz Tranz from the airport to major hotels. The fee is \$5.00 one way and runs at 5 after the hour and 35 after the hour from 5:00 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. Hotels that provide shuttle service are indicated by (*) on the map. To assure for airport pickup by hotel shuttle services, arrange for that with the hotel prior to your departure from home.

The taxi fare, one way from the airport to downtown, is approximately \$20.00, tip not included. There are four major cab companies providing quick, efficient services. They are as follows:

AIR TRANSPORTATION

As with convention rates at hotels, the fellowship can take advantage of volume discounts offered as standard business procedure by other vendors. These are participating companies and the business relationship does not imply endorsement.

The World Convention Corporation has made arrangements with two airlines who are willing to offer our members slightly lower air fares. For those traveling by air who elect to use American Airlines or Delta Airlines, they are offering special rates which afford a 5% bonus off published round-trip fares within the United States and San Juan, providing all rules and conditions of the airfare are met. If special fares do not coincide with your travel

dates, a 40% discount off unrestricted round-trip coach rates will be offered. (Travel solely on Connection Carriers, and travel from Canadian cities will apply at a 35% discount.) Seven days advance reservations and ticketing will be required.

If you want what we have to offer, and are willing to make the effort to get it, then you are ready to take certain steps. These are the principles that made our recovery possible.


- We admitted we were powerless over our addiction, that our lives had become unmanageable.
- We came to believe that a power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
- We made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.
- 4. We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- We admitted to God, to ourselves and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- We were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
- 7. We humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
- We made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
- We made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
- We continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.
- 11. We sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God, as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
- Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to addicts and to practice these principles in all our affairs.


THE 12 TRADITIONS OF NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS




