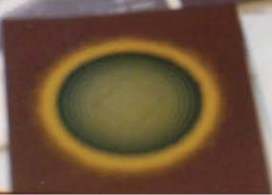

WCNA-21 "THE GIFT"

The members of the Australian Host Committee are organized and are busy preparing to bestow "The Gift", down under style, upon members who are planning to attend the 21st World Convention. It is scheduled for the 4th thru the 6th of October 1991, in Sydney, Australia.

Representatives from the World Convention Corporation recently completed a visit to Australia where they negotiated Hotel and Convention Center agreements. Preparations are steadily progressing and the convention is starting to take shape. As more detailed arrangements are made they will be reported in the *Newsline*.

It will be necessary for any member in North America or Europe who intends to travel to Australia to acquire a passport as well as a visa. An important note is that visa applications for Australia are only valid for eleven (11) months from the time of their submission. So for the trip to the World Convention members should wait until the 1st of October to apply. Visa application forms will be available from the WSO beginning September 15th 1990.

Interested members should contact the WSO to have a form mailed to them. Please note that you must have a passport prior to applying for a visa. Passport applications can usually be acquired from your local Post Office. If not, then you may have to refer to your local Yellow Pages to find a location near your home to pick up an application.

The following is a reprint of some information we published in a previous edition of the *Newsline* which is a letter from the Australian Consulate:

"A visit was recently made to the Australian Consulate to inquire about some of the immigration policies of the Australian Government because of the increasing number of questions we have received from members. Normally Australia is as difficult a country, for ex-offenders, to get into as the United States. Members with criminal histories, who plan to attend the convention, will need to apply for a visa starting in September 1990. The Australian government does not grant visas longer than six months in advance of the intended arrival date. However, if you anticipate having to provide additional information as described below, starting in October will allow adequate time for communications and research and processing of your application. These are the important points from our discus-

sion with the Australian Consulate regarding this issue.

All persons entering Australia must meet the character requirements, referred to in the Migration regulations and the Australian public interest criteria.

A person is unable to meet this character requirement if the applicant:

- (A) has at any time been convicted of a crime and sentenced to death, to imprisonment for life or to imprisonment for a period of not less than one year or
- (B) has at any time been convicted of 2 or more crimes and sentenced to imprisonment for a period totalling not less than one year; or
- (C) has at any time been charged with a crime and either found guilty of having committed the crime while of unsound mind or acquitted on the ground that the crime was committed while the person was of unsound mind; or
- (D) has been deported or excluded from another country
- (E) has in the reasonable belief of the Minister, been involved in activities indicating contempt, or disregard, for the law or for human rights; and has at any time been convicted of offenses in circumstances indicating, in the reasonable belief of the Minister, and habitual contempt, or disregard, for the law."

To summarize this jargon; a person who has been excluded or deported from another country, been convicted of a crime or crimes and sentenced to prison for a year or more whether suspended or not, is an habitual criminal or has been classified as being criminally insane, would normally be automatically refused a visa.

However, an officer may consider waiving this character requirement taking into account:

- ★ the nature of the offense(s) or of any such involvement
- ★ the age of the applicant when the offense was committed
- ★ how long ago the offense(s) was committed
- ★ how many offenses were committed; and
- ★ the applicants record since.

Each and every application will be considered on its own individual merits and an applicant may be interviewed to assist in the determination.

On the reverse of the Application for a Visitor Visa for Australia, Form 48 question 20, repeated below, covers the public interest criteria:

Have you or anyone included in this application:

Suffered from any dangerous contagious disease such as tuberculosis?

Suffered from any mental illness?

Used or been addicted to or trafficked in narcotics?

Been convicted of or have any charges outstanding on a criminal offense in any country?

Been deported or excluded from any country?

Had a visa for Australia cancelled?

If "yes" to any of the above give details:

It is important that all attendees to the scheduled World Convention answer question 20 truthfully and as thoroughly as possible, supported by medical reports or statements of record of criminal conviction(s) issued by the appropriate authorities (if applicable) and clearly identify themselves as attendees to the convention.

There is benefit to Australia as a result of this convention. Aside from the tourist income, the growth and strength of recovery in N.A. in Australia will benefit. **The Australian Consulate has assured N.A. that full consideration will be given to all applications lodged by delegates to the convention.**

The registration flyers for this convention will be available in late September or early October. One of the things that will be a little different will be that the WCC will function as the booking agent for members from North America and Europe who are going to WCNA-21. The registration forms as well as the hotel reservation forms will be sent back to the WCC for processing. This is being done so that the WCC can minimize the risk of the fellowship's funds as it relates to the hotel obligations. The cut-off dates for hotel rooms for this convention will be much earlier than previous world conventions. For more information about WCNA-21 please contact WCC at:

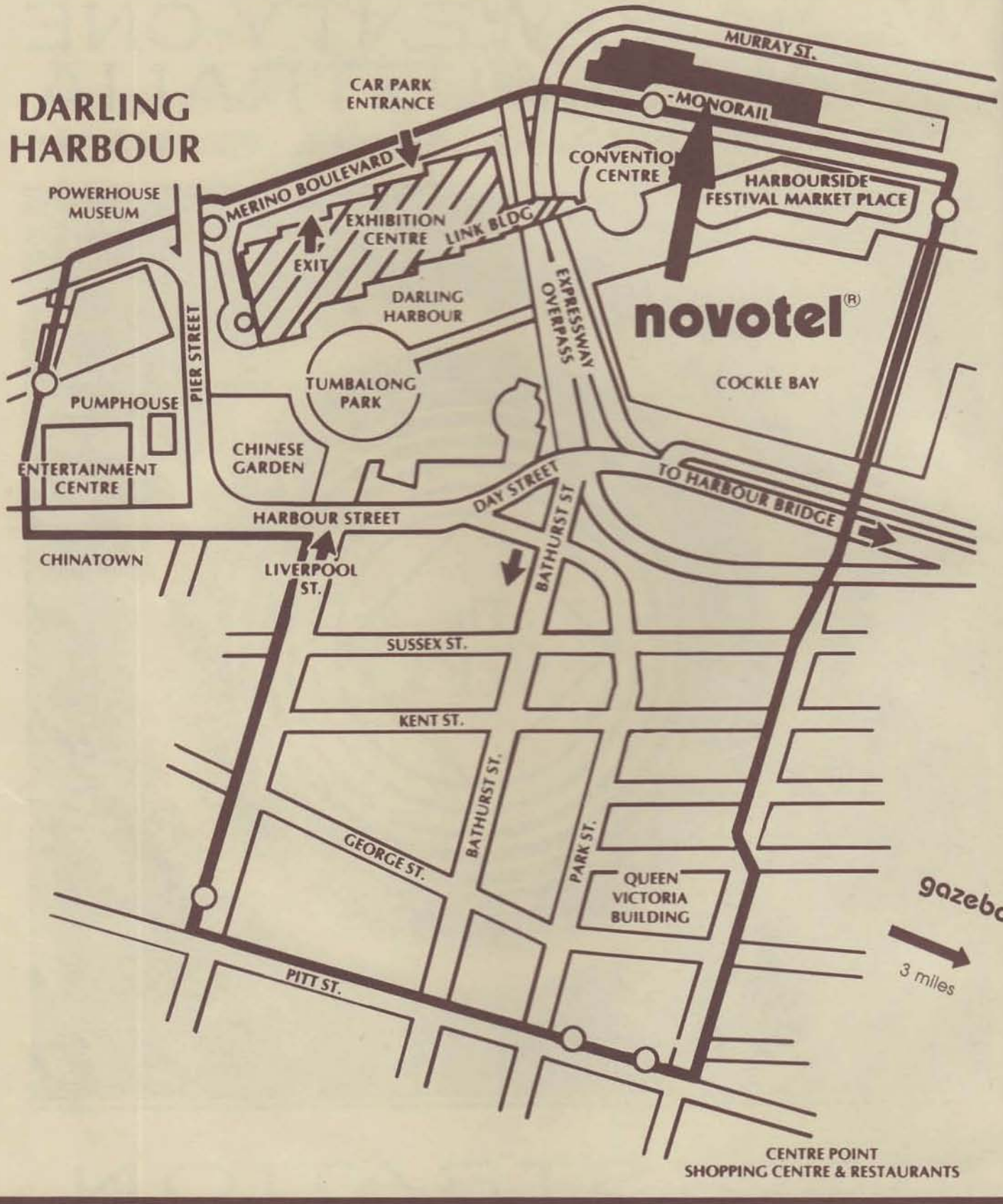

**HOTEL
INFORMATION**

WCNA-21 has made arrangements with two hotel properties in Sydney to accommodate our attendees. For those members who elect to use a travel agent the rooms can be booked on your behalf as long as the deposit requirements, outlined below, are met.



**NOVOTEL
SYDNEY**

The primary hotel for this convention is the Novotel Sydney whose address is 100 Murray Street Pyrmont Sydney, NSW 2009 Australia. The Novotel Sydney is approximately 250 feet from the front door of the convention centre, where all of the convention activity is going to be focused. This is the facility where the Marathon Meetings and Hospitality Room will be located.

The hotel will hold the block of rooms for WCNA-21 until June 30, 1991. After that time any rooms required will be booked upon a space available basis. It is very important that you send in your deposit as soon as possible.

IMMIGRATION INFORMATION

All U.S., Canadian, or European citizens planning to travel to Australia will be required to have a valid passport and visa to enter the country. The only exceptions to this are countries who have waivers for this requirement. Members who believe that they live in one of these countries should contact the Australian Consulate in their country to determine whether this waiver applies to their nation. The basic immigration requirements are detailed below.

If you anticipate having to provide additional information as described below, start as soon as possible to allow adequate time for communications, research and processing of your application. These are the important points from our discussion with the Australian Consulate regarding this issue.

All persons entering Australia must meet the character requirements, referred to in the Migration regulations and the Australian public interest criteria.

AIR TRANSPORTATION

The World Convention Corporation has procured agreements with two airlines to provide travel.

Usually the agreements would have included a direct discount off of the published fares for the particular trip. However, this year we are unable to have our agreements have the same format. It is not legal for carriers to discount what is known as the Base Tariff

fares for international travel. This is a measure that was created to protect the national airlines of foreign nations from having their airfares constantly undercut by airlines in other countries. The result of this would usually be that a travel agent would provide the discount and all travelers would contact a particular agent to receive a discount. Since the WCC is not willing to publish the information about a specific agent it has made this agreement slightly more complicated.

The airlines have agreed to assume this responsibility and will refer members (who express that they wish to receive the assistance of an agent) to travel providers, who will provide the discounts. Presently the provision calls for approximately 11% to be taken off of the lowest published fare at the time of booking.

Any discount provision associated with this agreement would normally apply to the Sydney based legs of travel by referencing the contract numbers below. However the agents will be able to provide more specific information about combined destination travel.

It will be necessary for members who wish to use American Airlines to request referral to an agent to receive the discount. The toll free number is 1-800-433-1790.

Please be advised that there are restrictions associated with these tickets. Those restrictions may deal with the allowed departure and return days, the minimum stay, or other parameters relative to the trip. The ticket agent will be able to explain these restrictions.

OTHER TRAVEL

The World Convention Corporation is not making any provisions for travel within Australia. Each individual is responsible for making all arrangements for other travel themselves. Australia offers many exciting places to visit besides Sydney. Members may decide to plan a visit to the Great Barrier Reef which is on the north eastern part of the Australian continent. Another popular attraction is Ayers Rock which is located in the Northern Territory section of Australia. These are but two of the variety of beautiful and exciting places Australia has to offer the traveler. Your travel agent can provide you with information about the attractions of this beautiful country.

An important note for those not familiar with Australia is that Australia is a continent and therefore the distances between some of the attractions may be many miles (kilometers) from Sydney. Please take great care in making your travel arrangements so as to provide ample travel time if you plan other travel in the country.

We have also been informed that any additional travel that is booked prior to arriving in Australia is usually 30% less

expensive than if you waited until you get in Australia to make arrangements. This being the case members will probably want to make all arrangements for travel before leaving their home country.

Ground Transportation

There will be commercial shuttle transportation service, to the hotel, available at the airport as well as taxis. The shuttle services average \$6.00 Aust. for a trip into the city. Members who are traveling in a group may find it more convenient to share a taxi into the city at an approximate cost of \$12.00 Aust. divided by the number of members traveling.

Parking

Parking is available in a commercial facility directly outside of the Darling Harbor Convention Centre and for those members who are staying at the Novotel parking is available in the same facility at no additional charge. The rates for those not staying at the hotel are as follows:

CONVENTION ACTIVITIES

The host committee in Australia is busy planning a wonderful convention. There is a boat tour of the Sydney Harbor at \$15.00 Aust. each planned for Friday, October 4th, which will depart from Darling Harbor Convention Centre and take members past the beautiful Sydney Opera House, continue all the way out to the harbor entrance, and return.

The convention will have a style that is very similar to the format of the Australian Regional conventions with the insertion of some of the traditional world convention format. Convention registration will begin on Friday morning and continue through the day. The merchandise area will open at the same time. As usual there will be mara-

thon meetings in the hotel as well as a hospitality area.

The first main meeting will not be held until Friday night, October 4th, with the evening culminating in a huge Dance Party, \$10.00 Aust. per ticket, which is an activity full of live entertainment.

On Saturday there will be workshops during the day, the main meeting, followed by a talent show in the auditorium. The local members will be conducting a talent search to get acts for this event.
