Dear WCNA-25 Registrant:

The World Convention Corporation wishes to thank you for your support and we look forward to seeing you this September in Paris, France for WCNA 25, "UNE NOUVELLE VISION DE LA VIE." We recognize that this may be the first time many members may be attending a WCNA event, outside of your home country, region or area. In order to alleviate some of the potential confusion, which can be associated with a trip such as this, we have included some travel tips. Hopefully, they will enable you to enjoy a pleasurable trip and smooth arrival into Paris and finally to WCNA 25 at Disneyland.

Required Identification and Emergency Contacts:

- Make sure that your Passport is current and valid. You should make a copy of the first page and keep it in your luggage (just in case you lose your passport).
- If your passport is lost or stolen make and official report in any police station.

Airport Traveling to Paris

- You should arrive at your international carrier at least 90 minutes prior to your departure.
- Carry your passport on your person when traveling. You will need it for checking your luggage at departure.
- Wear comfortable fitting clothes and shoes on the flight. Especially wear comfortable shoes because swelling may occur due to the duration of the flight and the altitude.

Arriving at the Airport in Paris

- A Minibus may, depending upon the airport of your arrival, take you from the plane to the terminal.
- Your passport will be required for entry into Paris within the terminal. There are directional signs that will guide you to the entry visa points.
- After your passport is stamped with an entry visa directional signs will then point you to the direction of the baggage claim area.

(Please read the Security Section)

- After retrieving your luggage, directional signs will indicate where to catch the shuttle bus for Disneyland Paris. The shuttle bus costs 80FF and runs 30-45 minutes.

Security

- The city of Paris is very security conscious pertaining to terrorism. When in the airport, please take the following suggestions when in Paris airports:
- Keep your luggage with you at all times
- Don't leave your luggage unattended
- Don't accept packages to carry from people that you don't know
- Do not carry any items that may look like a weapon
- Keep your passport with you at all times

Currency Conversion

- **The currency used in France and at WCNA 25 will be the French Franc.** All merchandise sold at the convention will have to be paid for in French Francs. Make sure that you have changed your money before coming to France or upon arrival. There are exchange offices in most international airports and in most central neighborhoods in Paris. Money may also be exchanged at Disneyland Paris at the front desk in your hotel. Typically, you can get better exchange rates in Paris rather than in your home country.
- As always, be conscious of carrying large amounts of money on your person. Your safety is of paramount importance to the World Convention Corporation.

Due to excessive bank processing fees, no personal checks will be accepted at WCNA-25. There are cash (ATM) machines located at Disneyland Paris. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

Time

- Europe utilizes military time to denote the time of day. This means that 11:30AM is stated as 11h30, but 11:30PM is stated as 23h30. 12:00 midnight would be 00h00, while 12 noon would be 12h00. Use the military standard for time dependent activities while in Paris.

Language

- While in Paris, it is a good idea to have a French phrase book and dictionary because many people will not be able to speak your language. For example, most taxi drivers and train employees speak only French.

For round trip weekend travel, add \$20.00 US.

Packages include: round trip air transportation on US Air or Air France, 5 days/4 nights accommodations (based on double occupancy) at the headquarters, Hotel New York in Disneyland Paris; shuttle service between the Paris Airport and Disneyland Paris; and all taxes. All packages are priced per person and based on availability. Connecting flights from other cities are available for an additional charge.

All travel must occur between 8 September and 22 September in order to get the discount airfare. If you would like to stay longer than five days at the Hotel New York, add \$66US per day to the cost of the package. If you would like to stay additional days at another hotel in Paris, Travel Smart Inc. can assist you with your plans.

While there is no deadline on reservations, we suggest that you book your package early, preferably by 15 April 1995.

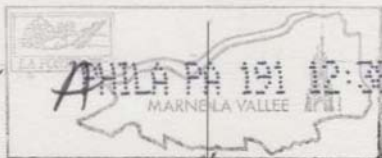

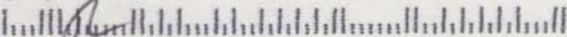

THE TWELVE STEPS OF NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS

1. We admitted that we were powerless over our addiction, that our lives had become unmanageable.
2. We came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
3. We made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.
4. We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
5. We admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
6. We were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
7. We humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
8. We made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
9. We made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
10. We continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.
11. We sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
12. Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to addicts, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

General Information

For safety reasons, the New York Convention Centre will be a non-smoking facility throughout the convention. Smoking is allowed just inside the main entrance of the Convention Centre and in the Hotel New York. Please help us by only smoking in the designated smoking areas.

All times listed in this program are in European time which is based on a twenty-four hour clock. For example, 4:30 pm in the United States would be 16h30 in Paris.

The official currency of the convention is French francs. All cash sales will be accepted in French francs only. All prices include approximately 20% VAT (sales) tax and a small service charge for currency conversion.

The boat cruise will be on the *Vendettes du Pont Neuf* on the River Seine, in Paris, and is approximately a forty-minute ride from the Convention Centre by bus. Buses will depart from outside the main entrance of the Convention Centre immediately following the Friday night main meeting. The last bus will depart no later than 21h30. The bus ride to the cruise will include a sightseeing tour in Paris. The tour does not include sufficient time to actually stop at these sites.

The Saturday night Chateau Party at *Le Chateau Royal Du Vivier* in the French countryside town of Fontenay-Tresigny is approximately a twenty-minute ride from the Convention Centre by bus. Buses will leave for the chateau promptly at the time printed on your ticket. Return buses will run every thirty minutes beginning at 01h00, with the last bus leaving at 03h00.

All workshops and main meetings are open to addicts or anyone interested in finding out more about Narcotics Anonymous, however only addicts may share at these workshops. Marathon meetings are closed meetings, open only to addicts or those who think that they may be an addict.

In line with the belief that we can only keep what we have by giving it away, we offer the opportunity for members to give a newcomer donation to facilitate the attendance of newcomers with thirty days or less at the convention.

Responsibility Statement

Please keep in mind that your conduct is a reflection on NA. If you are unable to conduct yourself in a responsible manner, you will be asked to leave. Shirts and shoes must be worn in all hallways and public areas at all times. Please keep in mind not everyone stays up late nor all night. We need to have peace and quiet in the hallways between the hours of 21:00 and 8:00. Please keep the noise level in the rooms to a minimum. The committee has provided a hospitality suite for the convenience of group gatherings around the clock.

Clarity Statement

We are presented with a dilemma when NA members identify themselves as addicts and alcoholics or talk about "living clean and sober." The clarity of the NA message is blurred. To speak in this manner suggests that there are two diseases, that one drug is somehow separate from the rest requiring special recognition. Narcotics Anonymous makes no distinction between drugs. Our identification as ADDICTS is all inclusive allowing us to concentrate on our similarities, not our differences.

Press Statement

Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films. This is to protect the membership and the reputation of Narcotics Anonymous. We do not disclose last names, nor appear in the media as members of Narcotics Anonymous. No individual inside or outside the fellowship represents Narcotics Anonymous. If you are approached by members of the press, please contact Convention Information. They will be more than willing to assist you.

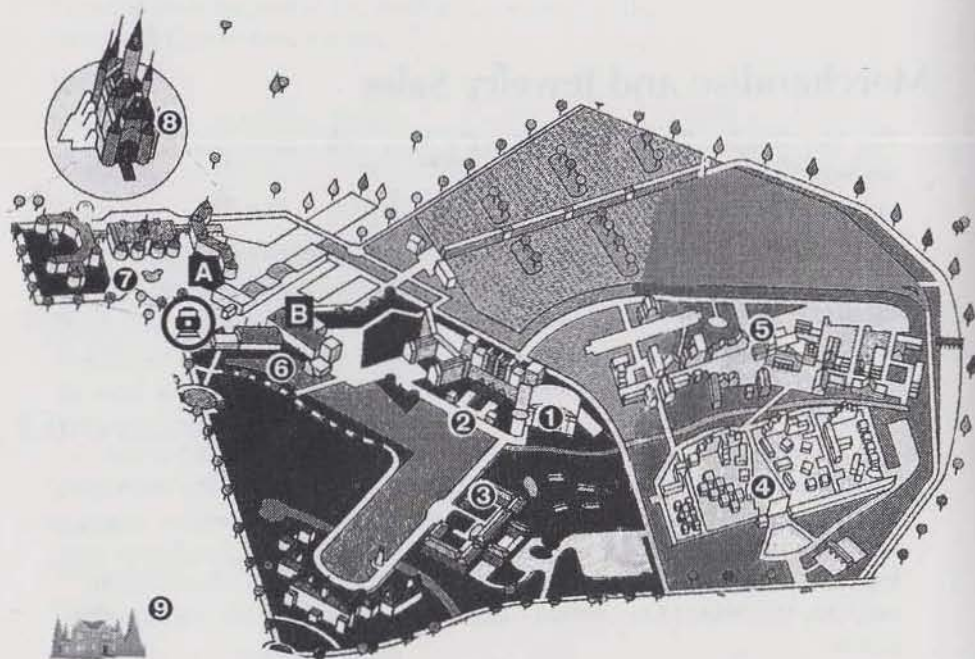

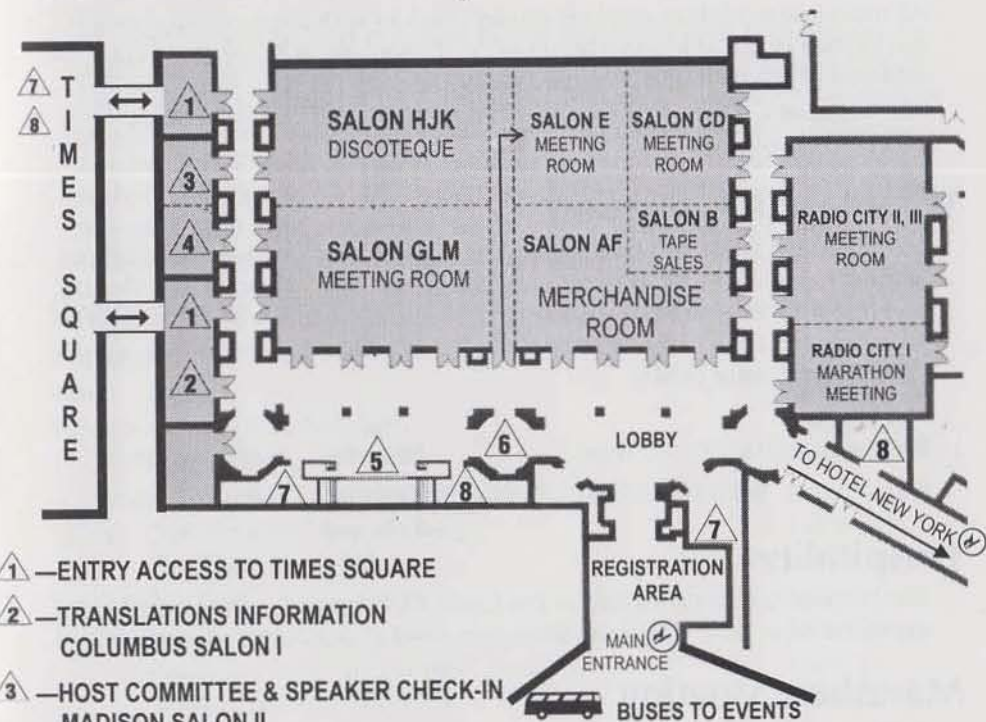
Disneyland Paris Map

3. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using.
4. Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or NA as a whole.
5. Each group has but one primary purpose—to carry the message to the addict who still suffers.
6. An NA group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the NA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
7. Every NA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.
8. Narcotics Anonymous should remain forever non-professional, but our service centers may employ special workers.
9. NA, as such, ought never be organized, but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.
10. Narcotics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the NA name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
11. Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.
12. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

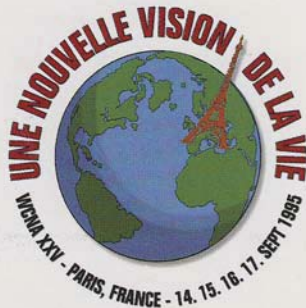

COMMUNICATION

To send mail use the mail boxes and the post offices, which you can recognize by the yellow sign "LA POSTE". The post office called "LA POSTE DU LOUVRE" (on the rue du Louvre) is open 24 hrs-a-day, 7 days-a-week.

In most telephone booths you must use a telephone card which you can buy in tabacs, at the postoffice or sometimes in the metro. There are two types of telephone cards : one for 40 francs (50 units) and another for 90 francs (120 units). To call outside of France, dial 19, followed by the country code (United States = 1 + area code, Portugal = 351 + area code, Germany = 49 + area code, Italy = 39 + area code, Spain = 34 + area code). After 21:30 (9:30 pm) calls are half the daytime price

AMUSEMENTS

Foreign films are often shown in their original language version with french subtitles. If this is the case it is indicated by "V.O" (version originale). The price of a cinema is usually between 40 and 50 francs. For amusement and cultural activities (museum, monuments, theater, opera, art exhibitions, movies, discoteques, buy "Pariscope", a 3-franc guide on sale in magazine stands. It comes out on wednesday, which is the day that new films come out. There is an English-language section in Pariscope.

Most museums are closed on Tuesdays. The Office of Tourism is located at : 127 avenue des Champs Elysee (tel: 49.52.53.54).

Metro: Charles de Gaule-Etoile. There you can find guides, detailed maps and all sorts of other tourist information in several language.

RESTAURANTS

the price of drinks in cafes are different depending whether you stand at the counter (least expensive), sit in the cafe (more expensive), or sit outside on the terrasse (most expensive). The big cafes on the major boulevards are more expensive than the little cafes on side streets.

In cafes and restaurants, service is included in the bill. An appropriate tip is between 5 and 10 percent of the bill.

TRANSPORTATION

The metro and the RER stop running at about 12:30 am (0:30). You can ask for a metro map in any station metro.

The Paris-Disneyland connection is on the RER ("Marne-la-vallee" station for Disneyland). The trip costs about 75 francs round-trip. The last train leaves Paris at about midnight and the first train leaves at about 5:30 am. By taxi the trip costs about 300 francs one-way (maximum 3 person).

At the train station or at the "Disneyland" bus, there is a bus service which will take you to your hotel. It's simple and practical. There are 12 500 taxis in Paris. You can get a taxi by calling different phone numbers (compagnie G7: 47.39.33.33 or 47.39.47.39). If you call a cab the meter starts running from the moment the call is received. In the streets taxi stations are indicated by a sign "TAXI". Taxis can stop in the streets if the lighted sign on the roof of the cab is lit. Normal tips for a taxi are between 7 and 10 percent of the total on the meter. Taxis in Paris almost never accept more than 3 riders. Also, try to have change instead of just big bills.



SHOPPING

The prices marked on products in stores are generally including tax (TTC = toutes taxes comprises). If a price is given HT (hors taxe = not including tax), you must add 20,6% to the price.

In Paris there are Duty-Free shops where you can buy certain products (such as perfumes) without paying tax.

MONEY

The currency used in France and at the world convention is the French Franc. All merchandise sold at the convention has to be paid for in French francs. Make sure that you have changed your money before coming to France or upon arriving. There are exchange offices in international airports and in most central neighborhoods in Paris.

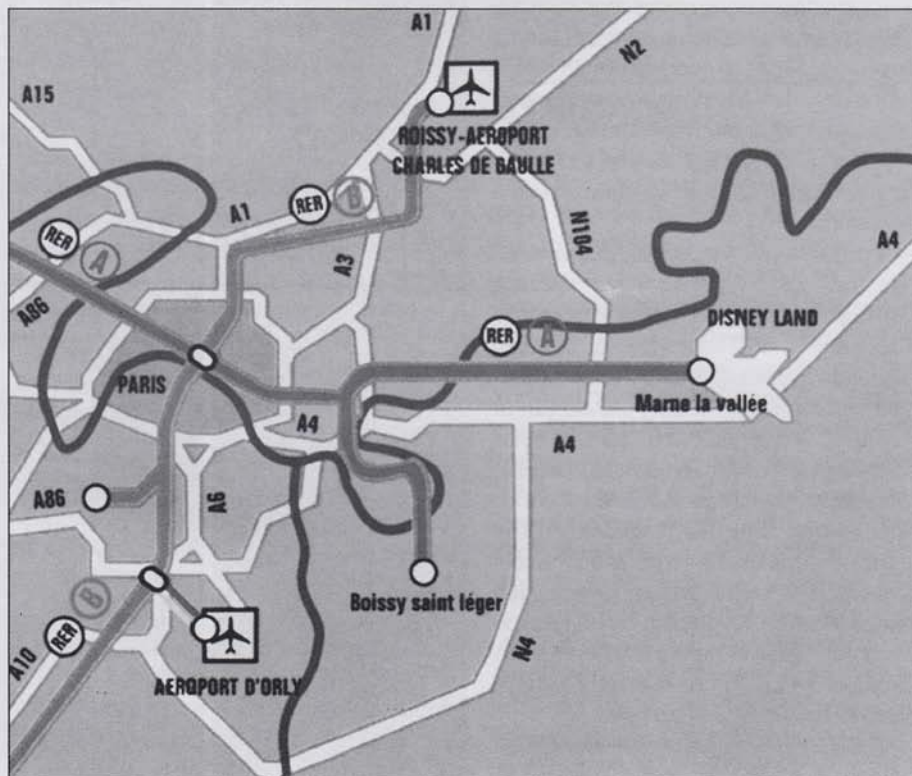

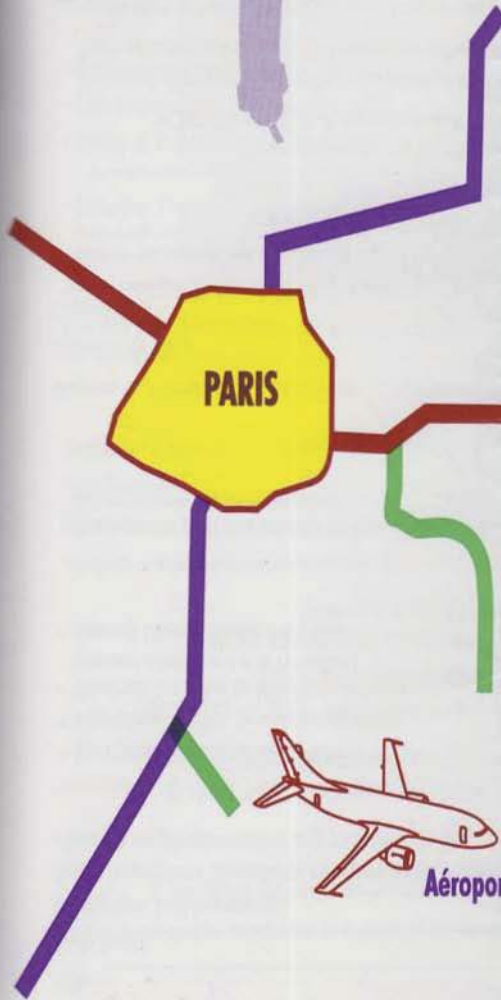

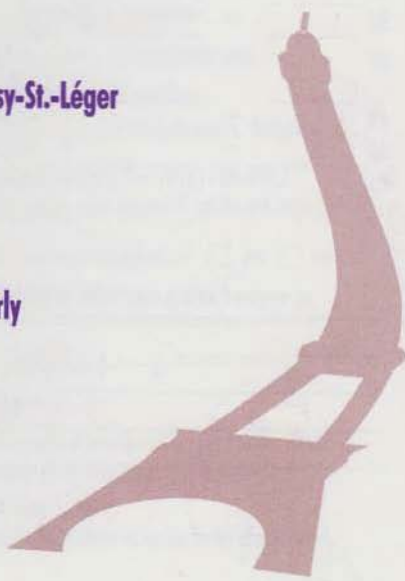

Travel Information

- **The official currency in France is the Franc.** As of January 1, 1995, One US Dollar was worth approximately five French Francs. We have used this figure to give you approximate prices in US Dollars. However, the currency exchange rate may change at any time. Current exchange rates are printed regularly in the business section of most daily newspapers.
- **Paris is served by two airports:** Roissy-Charles de Gaulle and Orly.
- **A valid Passport** is required for all non-European citizens entering France.
- **Airport Shuttles** leave from both airports every 45 min. for Disneyland Paris. Approximately FF75,00 (\$15.00US).
- **Train (RER from Paris/Chatelet-Les Halles to Disneyland Paris):** Line A4, direction Marne-La-Vallée. The trip takes approximately 40 min. and leaves every 16 min. 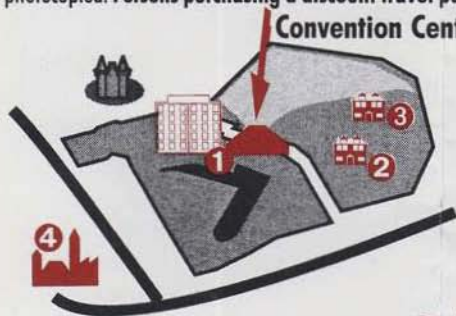
