

PERSONAL SAFETY

We take your SAFETY seriously. MARTA has received more than 17 awards by the American Public Transit Association as the safest transit system in the NATION! The MARTA system is a public facility, and like all public places, patrons should always take the usual precautions. The system uses closed-circuit, 2-way television to monitor each station.

MARTA police are armed and fully certified. More than 90 percent of the officers patrol trains and stations.

CAUTION

The magnetic strip on the Visitors Pass should be protected at all times from TV s, hotel keys, etc., that may be similarly charged.

HOW TO USE THE RAIL/BUS SYSTEM



At rail stations, simply insert your Visitors Pass into the slot in the top front of the fare gate and then retrieve it as you walk through the turnstile.



When riding the bus, slide your Visitors Pass through the card reader by the door. No transfer is needed with the Visitors Pass.



MARTA fare is \$1.75 without the Visitors Pass. Faregates at rail stations accept exact change, tokens, passes, transfers and cash cards. Token machines, located in each rail station accept \$1, \$5, \$10 and \$20 bills. Change is not provided, but is returned in tokens.



If you pay the \$1.75 fare and plan to transfer to a bus after your train ride, press the transfer button on top of the fare gate for a FREE transfer.





Online world convention registration, hotel reservation, and airline ticketing at www.na.org will be available beginning 3 December 2001! This is the first time in world convention history that you can do everything for the convention online through our website! This letter will help explain how to do it all. Enclosed is the long-awaited flyer for the 29th World Convention of Narcotics Anonymous. We are sending you the flyer with the hope that you will do everything online. By using our website you can make sure you get tickets to all the convention events and stay at the hotel of your choice, all without having to hassle with filling out the forms and mailing or faxing them back!

This is also the first year the convention will start at high noon on Thursday, the Fourth of July, with a Southern Fried Kickoff Luncheon followed by a recovery meeting. All the main meetings and most of the workshops and activities will take place at the Georgia World Congress Center (GWCC) in Downtown Atlanta. Some evening events will be held at the Marriott Marquis—the headquarters hotel for the convention.

Convention registration will open at the GWCC starting early Wednesday evening where you will be able to pick up your registration package. A pre-convention newsletter will go out to all registered attendees prior to the convention that will give you detailed information about registration times and where and when to pick up your tickets. The baseball game is on Wednesday night, so we will make sure to let you know where to pick up the tickets for that event.

REGISTRATION

Beginning 3 December 2001 you can register online for WCNA-29 and ensure you get tickets to all the convention events—we expect to sell out! If you want to order pre-registration merchandise and register at the lower price, pre-registration must be received before 3 May 2002.

If you have Internet access, the first thing you should do is register for the world convention. If you would like to register additional people, along with yourself, enter them as "guests" in the system. Go to www.na.org and click on World Service Events. From there go to the WCNA section and click the "Register Online" button. This will take you to a page called "NAWS Event Registration." You will be asked to provide a login name and password. If you have previously used this events site and have already created a login name and password, enter that information. If you have never logged into the site, we have provided you with a personal *temporary* login name and password created specifically for you. It is attached to your information in our system. The login name and password are case sensitive. Your *temporary* name and password are:

After you create a personalized login name and password and update your personal information, you can register for WCNA-29. Please remember to write down your personal login name and password because you will need it to register for any future NA World Service events.

You can modify your hotel reservation after it is made, however, you cannot modify your event registration online once it is completed. Should you require assistance with your online registration or have modifications, please contact Information Services at the World Service Office via email at webupdates@na.org or call (818) 773-9999, extension 775.

HOTEL RESERVATIONS

All you need to make a hotel reservation online is Internet access and a credit card! After completing your online registration, click on the link called "Make Your Hotel Reservation." You simply click on that link and it will take you to our Passkey housing site. The Passkey system will give you direct access to make your hotel reservation—at any one of the available WCNA-29 hotels seen in the flyer—at the world convention rate. Follow the instructions on the Passkey site, and if you have any problems please call the World Service Office at (818) 773-9999, extension 201. Please have your credit card ready in order to complete your online hotel reservation. If you would like to request a smoking room you must include that information in the comments section, otherwise you will automatically be given a non-smoking room. Smoking rooms are available on a first-come first-served basis. It is very important that your reservations are made **BEFORE** the cutoff date of 30 May 2002. After the cutoff date, convention rates may not apply and rooms may not be available.

After you have made a reservation, you can modify an existing reservation by going back to our website, clicking on WCNA-29, then clicking on "Modify or Cancel an Existing Reservation." It's that easy! You only need to fill out the Hotel Reservation Form on the registration flyer if you do not have Internet access.

AIRLINE RESERVATIONS

After you make your hotel reservations a link will take you back to the WCNA-29 home page. Click on "Make Airline Reservations." DO NOT MAKE HOTEL RESERVATIONS THROUGH THIS SITE—YOU WILL NOT GET THE WORLD CONVENTION RATE. At the end of the airline reservation site you will be asked for a credit card number. Tickets booked 60 days prior to your travel date will receive a ten percent discount, and tickets booked between 30 and 59 days prior to departure will receive a five percent discount. However, the confirmation screen will show a total dollar amount for your ticket(s) without the discount. Our travel agent will apply the convention discount to your ticket(s) before your credit card is charged. So when you get the confirmation of your airline ticket purchase, deduct the five or ten percent discount to know what your card will be charged. This is the only way to get this kind of convention discount online. If you do not have access to the Internet, you can call Montrose Travel at (800) 301-9673. There is a small fee for calling the agency directly, but in most cases you will still get a better rate with our group discount. Just make sure to mention that you are traveling to WCNA-29.

The Twelve Traditions of Narcotics Anonymous

- 1. Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends on NA unity.
- For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern.
- 3. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using.
- 4. Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or NA as a whole.
- Each group has but one primary purpose to carry the message to the addict who still suffers.
- 6. An NA group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the NA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
- 7. Every NA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.
- 8. Narcotics Anonymous should remain forever non-professional, but our service centers may employ special workers.
- 9. NA, as such, ought never be organized, but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.
- Narcotics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the NA name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
- 11. Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.
- 12. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.
