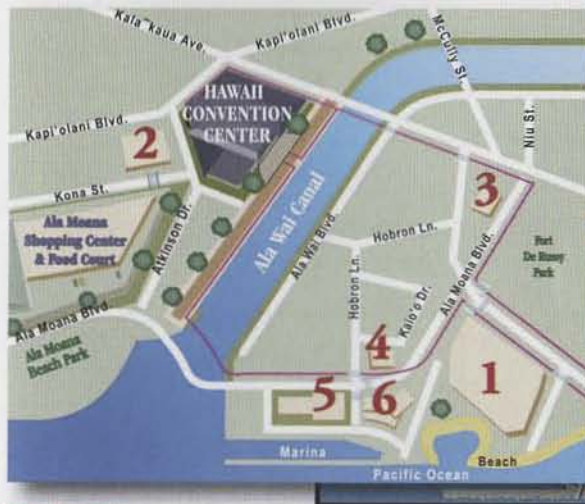

For many in our fellowship, a World Convention may be the first time you are traveling to another area, region, state, or country. So let us start with a heartfelt **Aloha** and assure you that just like in our rooms, you are not alone!



You're registered but what about your friends?

Chances are that if you are getting this newsletter you are already registered. Many of us have been asked why we should register for the convention, and why the cost of registration is more than regional or area conventions.

Here is what you can tell your friends:

The prices at the World Convention are set to cover direct expenses and not specifically to generate income for NA World Services. While the cost of registration may seem high, please keep in mind that putting on such a major event is very expensive and cannot be compared to the costs incurred at a typical regional convention. A typical World Convention costs more than a million dollars to produce! Registration fees cover many aspects of the convention's expense, such as facility rentals, translation services, shuttle buses, non-ticketed events, audio/video equipment, and labor costs, plus countless other expenses.

Here is where your money is going:

For this convention, about 35 percent of all the registration dollars goes toward facility expenses, 16 percent covers events included in your registration (i.e. dances and coffee houses), 10 percent pays for shuttle buses, 12 percent goes to planning and implementing the event, 15 percent is dedicated to the program, and 12 percent covers the sound and video for the meetings and events. Based on NA's principles of individual responsibility and self-support, we strongly encourage all those attending the World Convention to register.

And the most important question...What's in it for me?

Your convention registration badge gains you admission to the Kickoff Festival at Magic Island, the Coffee Houses, and dances and is required to board all shuttle buses. All other events require a ticket to attend. All workshops and main meetings are open to addicts or anyone interested in finding out more about Narcotics Anonymous, but only addicts may share at these workshops.

Hawaii

The Islands

There are seven inhabited islands that make up the state of Hawaii: Hawaii (called the Big Island), Maui, Molokai, Lanai, Oahu, Kauai, and Niihau.



WCNA-31 will be taking place on the island of Oahu, the most populated of the islands, and the location the state's capitol city, Honolulu. Appropriately, the meaning of Oahu is “the Gathering Place” and we look forward to gathering together in celebration of our recovery as “One Fellowship, Many Friends”.

Climate, Weather, and Dress

Often referred to as the perfect climate, warm pacific waters moderate the temperature within a comfortable range of 85 to 87 degrees in the summer days. Water temperatures range from 75 to 83 degrees always providing excellent swimming, diving, and surfing opportunities.

Island dress is very casual. Because of the warm and often humid weather, the preferred style of dress is loose cotton clothing. Hawaiian shirts and dresses are everywhere so if you have them, this would definitely be the place to wear them. Some restaurants may have a dress code so inquire ahead of time.

***Please Note:** Please be aware that the sun in Hawaii is very strong and can be very deceiving, causing you to think that it is not any stronger than your skin endures in any other place. Making this assumption could be a terrible mistake. While we want you to have all the fun you can while in Hawaii, we



strongly advise you to be careful in the sun and take reasonable precautions to protect yourself from sun-related problems.

Flying to Hawaii

For most of you, flying to Hawaii will include one or more long flights so dress comfortably. Please be aware that most airport security requires removal of outer wear such as shoes, belts, and jackets before clearing to board the plane. In today's world such security checks have increased check-in time so we strongly suggest arriving at the airport at least two hours prior to departure time for domestic travel, and three hours for international flights. Check with your airlines ahead of time to see if there have been any schedule changes. Most North American airlines no longer offer meals on flights. Be prepared, bring snacks or cash for purchases on your flight along with a bottle of water. Hawaii has its own time zone and does not adjust for daylight savings. Please be aware of this while traveling both to and from the island.

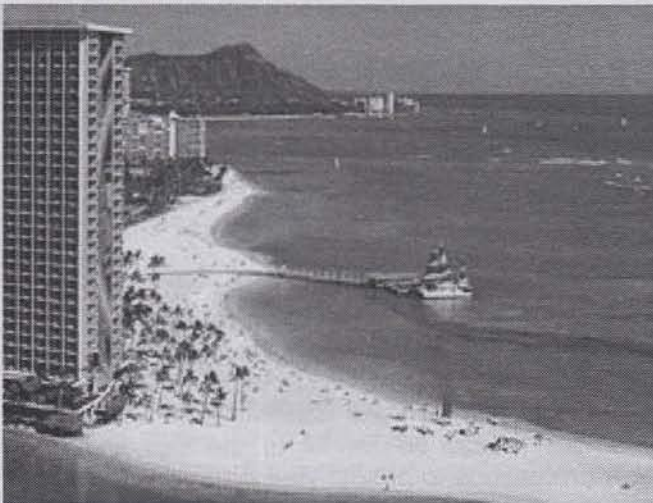

IF YOU'RE STAYING AT THE HILTON,

The Hilton Hawaiian Village has check-in kiosks right at the airport baggage claim areas G and H. If you are flying on United, Continental, Northwest and some American Airlines flights **you can check in and get your room keys while you collect your baggage!** No lines and no wait! All you have to do is bring the following:

1. Your Hilton confirmation letter.
2. A credit card to use for incidental charges.

The kiosks are in operation and have a Hilton attendant present during the hours of 9:00 am and 8:00 pm.

Hotel Credit Card Charges

If you made your original reservation using a credit card, please know that the hotels have not charged your credit card yet and will probably not do so until arrival. However, after 29 July 2005, if you cancel your reservation you will be charged (1) night's stay, and if you do not cancel at all, and just do not show up, hotels in Hawaii will often charge you for your entire stay.

A note about credit cards and ATM/check cards: Some of us have grown accustomed to using an ATM/Debit card instead of a regular credit card. Please note that the hotel will charge your ATM or check card for the FULL amount of your stay upon check-in and hold an additional amount to cover anticipated incidental charges (phone, movies, etc.) for all the nights you are staying at the hotel, potentially tying up funds you might have been relying on for food, shopping, or recreation.

For those of you using regular credit cards be sure you have enough credit to pay for your room and cover any additional deposits the hotel may hold to cover your incidental charges. If you do not have a credit card, the hotels require you to pay the full cost of the room upon arrival, and to put down a refundable security deposit for incidentals (phone, movie charges, etc.).
