

"World Convention of Narcotics Anonymous 2003 – San Diego, California"

(NOTE FROM THE EDITOR: In anticipation of WCNA 32, the next few EANA Free-Way Newsletters will have stories from members about their experiences at previous world conventions of Narcotics Anonymous.)

Hello I'm Roger I'm an addict. As most of you know we have a World Convention coming our way in a few months. In 2003, I had the opportunity to attend the World Convention in San Diego and it was the most awesome experience in my life. Never had I ever had the experience of so many addicts from so many different places in the world together in one place.

I know that a lot of people got to the convention via airplane which is good. I got to the Convention with 12 other people in a 15 passenger van, and believe me that was an experience in itself, if we didn't know each other very well by the time we got there we knew each other very well. There was also another vehicle with 7 more people in it but I can't share their experience. All I know is we had an awesome experience getting there like driving through a storm. I've been in many storms, but I had never drove through a storm – literally getting to the end of the storm and seeing what appeared to be the light at the end of the tunnel – which was the sun, at the end of the storm. Having a meeting in the van going 75 mph in the dessert of Arizona, sharing from the heart, and getting emotional about the journey we were taking. Having the driver at the time making one of the passengers so mad he wanted to be let off in Phoenix, get on a bus and come home and get loaded. We didn't let him off. Ha! Ha! Keep coming back. Out of those 12 people, 3 were children. 5 of us are still here. 1 is in prison but still clean, and 3 are out there using. Hope they make it back.

First of all the Convention Center in San Diego is enormous. There were speaker meetings, with speakers from all over the World, speaking on almost any N.A. topic you can think of. I got to attend a concert by [the group] War, and several other bands. Then there were the coffee houses in several of the hotels where there were marathon meetings around the clock, and addicts just hanging out and fellowshiping. Different hotels had speaker meetings at night, and DJ dancing, with music and video for that music. There was no time to be bored. There was always something going on.

One of the most awesome experiences was just walking down the streets of San Diego and seeing so many people wearing the same Convention Badge that I was wearing, and watching other people that had no idea who we were, wondering, why are so many people hugging in public, who are they, what do they belong to. Walking down the street and hearing some people speaking a language that sounded foreign, turning around and seeing six people walking behind me and asking them where they were from, their answer was "We're from Sweden are you from here". "No I'm from San Antonio, Texas. Welcome." Pictures were taken, hugs were exchanged, and before you know it there were like 15 to 20 people hugging in the middle of the sidewalk, welcoming the people from Sweden. And that was just one of the many different countries. There was also the man from China that was celebrating 1 year. At that time that was about the age of NA in China. The relapse rate in China before that was 100%. Over there they didn't send you to life in prison after 3 times, they just executed you.

The main Speaker Meeting was the greatest of all things. I remember seeing about 10 giant screens, not TV's but screens like about 20' x 20' so we could see the Main Speaker because there were so many people you couldn't get close enough. The screens were about 100' apart. Like I said the Convention Center in San Diego is enormous. At the end of the meeting we all circled up to close. It was an experience that I will never forget in my whole life. The chairperson announced that there were approximately 65,000 people in attendance. That's not how many people registered for the Convention itself – that's how many people were in the speaker meeting. Those meetings are free and open.

There is so much more that I would like to write about but I don't know how much space I have.
Thanks N.A. and thank all of you for giving me the life I have today. *In Loving Service, Roger S., Sr.*

“And Now a Word From our Sponsor”

Get-busy-find-a-sponsor-work-the-steps. Okay, maybe that's not a word. But it is a single concept. An addict might stay clean by attending meetings regularly (while not getting loaded in-between), but if you want recovery then: Get busy. Find a sponsor Work the Steps.

“If you want what we have to offer, and are willing to make the effort to get it, then you are ready to take certain steps. These are the principles that made our recovery possible.”

Getting clean usually provides an enormous relief from the consequences of addiction. The body heals, the mind clears, and hope again becomes part of our vocabulary. But drugs were never the original problem. They

were only a poor solution in which we found temporary solace from the *symptoms* of our disease. We still have to deal with the disease itself, as well as the emotional and spiritual fallout from our using. We do this through the twelve steps.

Hey-y-y. Wait a minute. I don't have any disease. If I could just get a some control over this little drug habit, I could finally make some money dealing, and me and what's-her-name will live happily ever after or I'll beat her ass...So what if my mom won't let me in her house, just because her purse came up missing last

time... Those stupid supervisors don't know shit they can't tell me what to do... It's not my fault – it's you – it's them – it's her – it's him – it couldn't possibly be --- me?

“We were searching for an answer when we found NA...it (sic) convinced us that we needed to change ourselves, instead of trying to change the people and situations around us.”

Remember that our best thinking got us here. If we want things to change, we must be willing to take direction from our higher power. But it's not easy establishing a relationship with a higher power. It takes willingness and effort and time.

Wel-l-l. Maybe I do have a small part in this. Le'me see those steps: one-two-three-four-five-six-seven-eight-nine-ten-eleven-twelve. I'm done. Read all twelve. What do I need a sponsor for?

“We should know from our past experience that our way of doing things did not work.”

Working the steps is no different from any other part of the N.A. program. We are following in the footsteps of those who went through this before us. We know that this program will work for us because they *are* just like us. We need a sponsor to not only show us the way, but to remind us that it can be done.

“Our only hope is to live by the example of those who have faced our dilemma and have found a way out. Regardless of who we are, where we came from, or what we have done, we are accepted in NA. Our addiction gives us a common ground for understanding one another.”

Isn't there an easier, softer way? Sure there is. It's: Get-busy-find-a-sponsor-work-the-steps.

Greetings! We are pleased to provide you with the following information about how to prepare for the 32nd World Convention of Narcotics Anonymous. The world convention is always a unique opportunity for the fellowship to come together and celebrate recovery in Narcotics Anonymous, and we hope this information will help you plan for the best convention yet.

You're registered, but what about your friends?

Chances are that if you are getting this newsletter you are already registered. Many of us who are already registered understand why registration is important. We hope the following information answers any questions you or your friends may have about why registration is important and why the cost of registration at the world convention seems higher than it is at most regional or area conventions.

Why the Cost of Registration at WCNA Is Higher Than at Other Conventions

In our ongoing efforts to make the world convention an even better experience we continue to take your input and make changes to the convention. This year you may have noticed, in response to your input, some distinct advantages for pre-registering and an increase in the availability of pre-registration merchandise. We have continued to provide increased events and services at the convention including a kickoff festival that is open to all registrants. However, the prices at the world convention are set to cover direct expenses, and in fact registration alone does not cover these expenses. We made pre-registration \$65 for this event and raised onsite registration to \$90. The simple fact is that guessing how many people might come to a world convention requires us to make commitments to facilities, shuttles, registration, and other items that cost money. The onsite registration fee is actually much closer to what it costs us to put on a world convention. What has become a typical world convention costs more than a million dollars to produce!

This year you may have noticed, in response to your input, some distinct advantages for pre-registering and an increase in the availability of pre-registration merchandise.

Twenty-eight percent of all registration dollars goes to cover the costs of special events like the kickoff festival, dances, coffee houses, and Rocky Recovery. Thirty-eight percent goes to facility costs for the dome and the convention center. A large portion of this expense is to accommodate those who have not registered yet or may never register. Twenty-two percent of registration covers program-related costs such as travel for nineteen funded speakers from around the world, translations, translators, and adequate audiovisual support so a great number of people can see and hear the main meetings. Finally, twelve percent goes to shuttles to move people from their hotels to the San Antonio Convention Center (SACC) and Alamodome. This includes special shuttles for those with additional needs.

And why are we telling you all of this? Because we need your help. It seems irresponsible to spend the fellowship's funds on costs for those who choose not to register. We try to accommodate those who are new by providing thousands of newcomer registrations for those with thirty days clean or less. But we plan to enforce the requirement for registration badges in order to ride the shuttles or to gain entry to any of the special events. You can help us enforce this. If you have a child under thirteen who needs a badge in order to ride the shuttles, please come to the convention information booth.

To help assist you in planning your days during WCNA-32 ahead of time, we will be posting the schedule for WCNA-32 meetings, workshops, and events before the convention for the first time.

And the Most Important Question...What's in It For Me?

Your convention registration badge gives you admission to the kickoff festival at Sunset Station, the coffee houses, and dances, and is required to board all shuttle buses. All other events require a ticket to attend. All workshops and main meetings are open to addicts or anyone interested in finding out more about Narcotics Anonymous. And as we mentioned earlier, you must wear your badge both to enter any of these events and to participate in them. Anyone not wearing a badge during special events covered by registration will be asked to leave.


If you are receiving this newsletter directly, it means you have pre-registered. At this convention we are offering access to the merchandise room in Ballroom B of the SACC for **pre-registrants only** from 3 pm to 8 pm on Wednesday and from 10 am to 1 pm on Thursday. The merchandise room will be open for all others beginning at 2 pm on Thursday. There will be three different registration badge colors for WCNA-32: gold for pre-registrants, green for onsite registrants, and blue for those with under thirty days clean.

Jewelry Sales

NA World Services contracts with an independent and licensed jewelry vendor for the world convention. This vendor sets their own hours of operation that are usually the same as our merchandise hours. While only pre-registrants will be able to access the WCNA-32 merchandise room on Wednesday and Thursday morning, jewelry sales will be open to all, and those hours will be listed onsite.

Additional Needs

If you or anyone you know has an additional need or requires special assistance, please go to www.na.org/wcna32 and read the information available there. You will also find a form that may be filled out so that we can better assist you. As always, we will be providing a special shuttle bus that can accommodate wheelchairs and scooters for transportation to and from your hotel and the convention center. We will make every effort to assist you in obtaining a scooter or wheelchair, but you **must** fill out the form online before making a reservation. We are not providing wheelchairs or scooters ourselves but are making reservations for you with an outside vendor. There is limited availability in San Antonio, so please help us by filling out the form as soon as possible, and absolutely no later than **5 August**. **Scooters and wheelchairs will not be available onsite unless you have made a reservation in advance.**



SAN ANTONIO CLIMATE, WEATHER, AND DRESS

The average high temperature in San Antonio at the end of August is 95 degrees Fahrenheit, so take heed of these suggestions from physicians and the local Red Cross to help you avoid heat exhaustion, dehydration, heatstroke, and sunburn:

DRINK WATER

At least eight to fifteen eight-ounce glasses of water or fruit juice (with a 50 percent water-juice concentration) during the day.

WEAR COOL FABRICS

Natural fibers in light colors work best. Wear a wide-brimmed hat or cap. Avoid dark clothing that can absorb heat.

USE SUNSCREEN

A minimum SPF of 15 at least twice a day.

SHADE YOUR EYES

UVA sunglasses.

BE CAUTIOUS

If you take antihistamines or diuretics, remember that they can rapidly deplete your body of fluids.

WCNA-32 GENERAL INFORMATION

This section of the newsletter outlines some of what you can expect during the actual convention. Please note that the primary locations for the convention are the Henry B Gonzalez Convention Center (which we call the San Antonio Convention Center or SACC), the Alamodome, and Sunset Station.

For all those who will be arriving early, local meeting directories will be available at all WCNA-32 hotels. Call the San Antonio area hotline at (210) 434-0665 for information on meetings in the city and surrounding areas.

Registration

You will be able to pick up pre-registration packages and pre-registration merchandise or to register onsite in Hall C, located on the lobby level of the convention center.

Registration and pre-registration merchandise hours (these hours are subject to change during the convention):

**Note: Registration will not reopen between the Thursday night main meeting and the kickoff festival, and you must have a badge to get into the festival.*

Registration packages will not be split up. For example, if you register three people, all three registrations must be picked up at the same time. The person picking up the package must be the person listed at the top of the confirmation unless you are one of the "guests" listed on the confirmation and have the confirmation letter in hand. **It's important to remember that we are not responsible for the replacement of lost convention registration badges, and we will not give you another badge if yours is lost or stolen. There are no refunds on registrations or special events.**

Hotel Credit Card Charges

If you made your original reservation using a credit card, please know that the hotels have not charged your credit card yet and may not do so until you arrive. You will need to present the card at check-in, regardless.

A note about credit cards and ATM/check cards: Some of us have grown accustomed to using an ATM/debit card instead of a regular credit card. Please note that the hotel will charge your ATM or check card for the FULL amount of your stay upon check-in and hold an additional amount to cover anticipated incidental charges (phone, movies, etc.) for all the nights you are staying at the hotel, potentially tying up funds you might have been relying on for food, shopping, or recreation.

For those of you using regular credit cards, be sure you have enough credit to pay for your room and cover any additional deposits the hotel may require to cover your incidental charges. If you do not have a credit card, the hotels require you to pay the full cost of the room upon arrival, and to put down a refundable security deposit for incidentals (phone, movie charges, etc.).

Hotel Cancellations

Any reservation canceled at any time after the reservation is made will incur a cancellation fee (deducted from cash deposits or charged to the credit card used to make the reservation) based on the following schedule:

- Hotel reservations canceled on or before 13 July 2007 will be assessed at a \$50.00 cancellation fee.
- Cancellations made after 13 July 2007 will be assessed a \$175.00 cancellation fee. If you do not cancel at all, and just do not show up, the same fee of \$175.00 will apply. Some hotels in San Antonio may charge you for your entire stay.

A limited number of tickets will be made available for sale onsite at the convention on a first-come, first-served basis in Hall C of the convention center when you pick up your registration package. Don't be left standing around just hearing about how awesome the events are going to be this year. Be a part of the experience. Be there.

For reserved tables, all ten tickets will be in one envelope. Your table number will be on your tickets and put in the envelope of the primary registrant who bought the table. The tables will be preassigned based on your registration date, so you do not need to wait in line for the meal events for which you have purchased a table. If you have reserved a table for yourself and your friends for the Saturday night banquet or the jazz and blues luncheons, please know that you don't have to rush to be seated. If you run into any problems, just grab an available usher to assist you in finding your seats. We will separate the lines for those with preassigned tables from those without to help make this easier on everyone. Those who have not reserved tables will be seated on a first-come, first-served basis. If you have reserved a table, help us out by not lining up to be one of the first seated, as this causes more traffic at the entry to the event.

There will be assigned seating for the comedy show with George Carlin and the Saturday night concert with ZZ Top. Seat assignment is based on your registration date, so the earlier you have registered, the closer your seat to the stage. This also applies for onsite registration, so make sure you register as soon as you can upon your arrival in San Antonio!

Newcomer Badges

In line with the belief that we can only keep what we have by giving it away, we offer the opportunity for members to make a special donation to pay for the convention registration of newcomers with thirty days or less clean time. Newcomer registration packages are only available to members with thirty days or less clean who cannot pay all or part of the registration fee. We ask that each member requesting a package make some contribution toward its cost, if able. We do not offer indigent packages or any other "discounted" registration package to any members with more than thirty days clean. We extend our sincere thanks and gratitude to those who make it possible to share the gift of recovery through your donations, as the number of newcomer packages offered is contingent on the donations received. Hours for newcomer badge pickup will be posted in Hall C, located on the lobby level of the convention center.

Convention Information (CI)

The CI booth will be in the hallway on the right as you enter the street level of the convention center. This is the place to go if you have any questions, need to be pointed in the right direction, want restaurant information, or just need a hug! For those who have traveled to San Antonio, the CI booth will also have information such as local meeting times and locations, local attraction information, and directions. CI will also make ADA shuttle arrangements for those who require it. There will be a phone connected directly to the CI booth. Beginning Wednesday, 29 August, **the WCNA-32 convention information phone number will be (210) 582-7015.**

Children

Please note that there is no day care for children. Parents need to monitor their children at all times. Children can attend events, but please keep in mind that events are geared toward members. For events that require a ticket, everyone must have a ticket except for children under the age of two or who can sit on your lap (same as the air travel rule). For badge-only events, all children twelve and under must be with someone who has a badge at all times. Special visitors' badges are available at convention information for those under thirteen. All children over the age of thirteen must have their own badge to gain access to those events requiring a badge.

Meetings, Workshops, and Forums

WCNA-32 meetings will officially begin with two speaker meetings on Wednesday night, one at 7 pm and one at 8:30 pm at the SACC. Meetings on Thursday begin at 2 pm in the convention center. All main meetings—Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights as well as Sunday morning—will take place at the Alamodome.

The World Board will be hosting their usual assortment of workshops, and we encourage you to attend. Also, for the first time we will be hosting two workshops about creating cooperative relationships with those whose profession touches the lives of addicts. These workshops will be held on Friday. One workshop will have invited professionals from corrections and drug courts, and one will have professionals from the medical and treatment fields.



Marathon Meetings

Marathon meetings will be held throughout the convention at the times listed below. Unlike convention workshops and meetings, marathon meetings are closed meetings, i.e., open only to addicts or those who think they may be addicts.

Getting Around San Antonio

San Antonio is a tourist town, and both walking and driving traffic are typically heavy during weekends. Unfortunately, this traffic is made worse by construction and the lack of parking downtown. All of this is to say that you are going to want to minimize your driving. The easiest way to do that is to just park your car for the weekend. You can easily walk to the dozens and dozens of restaurants along the Riverwalk. If you want to venture beyond the Riverwalk, downtown travel is a breeze on the VIA streetcar, an open-air, authentic reproduction of a rail streetcar that traveled the streets of San Antonio more than fifty years ago. There are four streetcar routes to downtown locations including the Alamo, the Spanish Governor's Palace, La Villita, Sunset Station, the Southwest School of Art and Craft, the Institute of Texan Cultures, the King William Historic District, and downtown shopping. There is convenient access to all routes from the downtown streetcar station at Convention Plaza. Fare is \$1.00. We're sure you'll find San Antonio to be a very convention-friendly city!

Shuttle Buses

For all registrants, shuttle buses will be provided between the convention center, Sunset Station, the Alamodome, and all official WCNA hotels operating on four bus routes. Once you check into your hotel you may board a bus at the designated pickup locations that will be posted at the hotel to head over to the convention center and either pick up your pre-registration package or register onsite. Shuttle schedules will also be posted at all the hotels and available at the front desks. Please be sure to note registration hours. While a badge is required in order to board shuttle buses, if you let the driver know that you have just checked in, you will be allowed to board a shuttle to get to the convention center your first time. As an additional reminder, if you have a child under thirteen years of age, please go to convention information for a badge for them.

Speaker Check-in

We ask that upon arrival at the convention, all main and workshop speakers check in as soon as possible at the program office in room 209 on the concourse level of the convention center.

Convention Center and Alamodome Parking

If you are staying in one of the convention hotels, simply park there and take the convention shuttle throughout your stay. For those of you driving into the convention, there is absolutely no public or handicapped parking at the SACC because it is currently under construction and will be during WCNA-32. The parking structure at the center was torn down completely, and they are in the middle of building a new hotel that will house the new parking structure for the center. Our primary parking lot for folks not staying in any of our hotels for the convention is located at the Alamodome. **There will be a limited number of handicap parking spaces available on a first-come, first-served basis.** Upon request, wheelchair access shuttles will be made available to transport you from the Alamodome parking lot to the convention center by calling convention information at (210) 582-7015 or by speaking to an attendant at the Alamodome parking lot. There is also one public parking lot near the convention center with a few handicapped spaces.

Alternative Merchandise

The alternative merchandise store will be open on Sunday, 2 September 2007, from 9 am to 10:30 am only at Sunset Station. Those wishing to sell items must complete the WCNA-32 Alternative Merchandise Letter of Agreement and must obtain a Texas Sales & Use permit. These forms and information for selling alternative merchandise can be found online at www.na.org/WCNA32/index.htm. **Please note that no onsite applications will be accepted.** There will be light breakfast items at Sunset Station to eat before the closing meeting, so come by and get some breakfast and check out alternative merchandise before the closing World Unity Day meeting.

Sunset Station

Rocky Recovery, coffee houses, a couple of late-night meetings, the gay and lesbian dance, and the kickoff festival will be held at Sunset Station. You can also stop by Sunset Station for something to eat in between the events, or on your way to main meetings. The WCNA shuttle will drop you off right in between the dome and Sunset Station.

Thursday Night Kickoff and Registration

Please be sure to register before the Thursday night main meeting. The main meeting is at the Alamodome, and the kickoff festival that directly follows is right outside the dome. **In order to get into the festival you must have a registration badge, and you will only be able to register at the convention center in Hall C. There is no satellite registration.** We're hoping to avoid having upset members who are turned away from the festival because they haven't registered yet. This means that if you don't have registration materials and come out of the main meeting to go into the kickoff festival at Sunset Station, you will be turned away and have to walk back to the convention center. Event staff will be working that entrance, and they are not in a position to make any exceptions—so please remember that no badge means no entrance!

First Aid/Paramedic

A room each in the convention center, Alamodome, and Sunset Station will be set aside for first-aid needs during the convention. If you have a problem during the convention, please see that facility's staff who will be available to assist you. The program guide will have additional information about how to get first-aid attention during the convention.

Nar-Anon

In the spirit of cooperation rather than affiliation, Nar-Anon will be present at the convention center with their own activities and area. They can be found in room 001 on the river level at the SACC.

Speakers and Speaker Tapes

Speakers must check in at the program office in room 209 of the concourse level of the convention center, and speaker tapes will be available in room 103 next to convention information.

Support Committee

The support committee is responsible for coordinating all of the thousands of volunteers needed to make WCNA a success. If you are interested in volunteering for the world convention once you are onsite, please go to convention information for more information.






Alamodome, the site of WCNA main meetings.




San Antonio Riverwalk

World convention growth brings exciting new changes and challenges

WCNA-32 to expand benefits offered to pre-registrants

Over the last ten years, the World Convention for Narcotics Anonymous has tripled in size. We continue to strive to make each world convention a unique celebration of recovery, and it's exciting to share that celebration with so many recovering addicts. At the same time, this extraordinary growth makes it increasingly challenging to plan and stage the event.

This article is meant to provide information about our three overarching goals in planning and staging the convention:

- 1) We design the convention with no intention of generating income for NA World Services.
- 2) We strive to enhance the convention experience for registrants.
- 3) We try to make the convention accessible to as many members as possible.

Sometimes these goals work against one another, however, requiring us to perform a very delicate balancing act in responsibly handling the fellowship's funds.

Did you know that the world convention is not designed to generate profit or revenue for NA World Services?

We carefully consider historical data to project potential attendance at each event. We are always mindful not to unduly risk the fellowship's funds in the planning of the event. For example, we purposely plan to sell out of merchandise before the event ends so that we don't spend money producing merchandise no one will purchase. Similarly, we project attendance conservatively, building only a small "pad" into the number of registration packets we order. These are just two of the many areas of convention expense that demand careful scrutiny and accurate planning in order for us to be responsible with the fellowship's funds.

Did you know that one of our primary goals is our constant focus on convention registrants?

We do all we can to enhance a registrant's experience at the convention. Today, your WCNA registration includes more events planned during the convention, and we look for ways after every convention to improve our processes and procedures. In 1996, we started offering pre-registration merchandise as a way to make sure that those who registered in a timely fashion would have access to merchandise without having to stand in line. In response to requests for WCNA-32, we will be significantly expanding the range and quantity of pre-registration merchandise offered for sale. In the past we have typically offered three to four items, but for WCNA-32 we will offer twelve different items, and we will expand the women's apparel offering wherever possible. We will also open the merchandise store sometime Wednesday afternoon—the first time it will be opened so early in the convention—and for an initial period we will provide first access

into the store for convention pre-registrants only.

Along with these benefits, we are making it easier for pre-registrants by eliminating the late registration fee that was previously imposed if you registered during the last sixty days before the convention—but we will still have a more expensive fee for on-site registration. This extended pre-registration period will give members eight and a half months to register for the convention and to purchase pre-registration merchandise. Pre-registering for the convention is the biggest way you can help us plan for your participation in the convention, by allowing us to accurately project attendance and costs in advance of the event. Pre-registering will also save you money by avoiding what will be a significantly more expensive on-site registration fee than we have charged at previous world conventions.

Note: One way to afford paying for your registration before the cutoff date would be to save just \$2 a week over the course of the pre-registration period.

Did you know that we have always strived to make the convention as accessible to as many members as is logistically and financially possible?

We encourage all attendees to register, but we have never yet required registration to attend recovery meetings. As we grow, however, this presents new challenges. Actual attendance at our world convention is at times up to 33% higher than the number of paid registrants. For example, in San Diego our attendance was around 22,000, but only 14,000 chose to pay for convention registration. Our continuing growth has meant we are outgrowing many convention centers and arenas—and the larger the convention gets, the more our meeting-related costs increase. In San Diego, only two-thirds of the attendees absorbed these costs. Currently, convention registrants cover approximately \$300,000 in expenses to offset the cost of providing access to meetings for those who choose not to register.

We realize that the registration fee for a world convention is higher than the registration fee for a local convention, but these are not equitable comparisons. A world convention held in North America costs almost \$3 million to produce. We spend more money on sound, video, translations, and facility-related fees for WCNA recovery meetings than most regional conventions spend on their entire event. Convention registration is used to cover most of those costs. Additional expenses, like the cost of unplanned shuttle buses or last-minute printing of registration badges, are incurred when more people show up at the event than the number we have planned for. Please help us make WCNA-32 an enjoyable and memorable event for you by pre-registering for the convention as early as possible.


We also have a growing problem with people making multiple room reservations and cancelling them at the last minute. This puts the fellowship's funds at risk because it makes it more difficult for us to fulfill our contractual obligations to the hotels and reservations company. Reducing the proliferation of multiple reservations also makes more rooms available to members on a first-come, first-served basis. It is like not saving seats in a meeting and allowing those who show up first to have the best seats. You will see a new room-cancellation policy for this convention.

All of these realities must be carefully balanced against our commitment to be responsible with fellowship funds while striving to provide a unique, high-quality celebration of recovery that is inviting to everyone. We are committed to continuing to look for ways to improve our staging of the convention so that we enhance your convention experience with each event.



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
