WCNA 33 Registration

Registration for WCNA 33 will be located in the main lobby — Entrance Hall — of the Centre Convenciones Internacional Barcelona (CCIB). Pre-registration, registration, pre-registration merchandise, Convention Information, and NAWS displays as well as those celebrating the 25th anniversary of the Spanish Region will all be accessible during the following hours:

Registration hours

19 August	Wednesday	15:00 to 20:00 h
20 August	Thursday	10:00 to 19:30 h
21 August	Friday	10:00 to 22:00 h
22 August	Saturday	10:00 to 20:00 h

Registration and all other activities at WCNA 33 accept payment in Euros only. A limited number of onsite registrations will be available at €95. We accept cash of course, and can process Visa, MasterCard, and American Express. No checks will be accepted. There are no ATM machines in the CCIB, but there are several across the street in the Diagonal Forum Mall.

The pre-registration area is organized in alphabetical lines. Your pre-registration package will be under the first letter of your last name. Please be sure you get into the correct line or the volunteer at the registration counter will not have your information. It is helpful if you have your pre-registration confirmation with you. If you do not have it, please be prepared to show identification. The primary registrant is the only person who can pick up the total pre-registration package, which includes the tickets needed to pick up your pre-registration merchandise. The primary registrant can pick up all registration packages and tickets. If you registered with someone else as their "guest," you can pick up your own registration badge and package (not including the merchandise tickets) if that is more convenient, providing you have your confirmation letter with you.

A pre-registration package includes your badge and a package of convention-related information and NA material. If you ordered pre-registration merchandise you will be given an envelope containing a ticket for each item you ordered. Please check your tickets and badges before you leave the registration

With the 33rd World Convention only months away, we are all very excited and looking forward to being together again in Barcelona, Spain to celebrate "Love Without Borders."

We currently have over 2500 people pre-registered for the convention! It's hard to say how many people have made hotel reservations because we understand that a lot of people have found discounted hotel rates. We attempted to lower our rates because of the economy around the world, but as we said before, many of these rates were negotiated in much better times. NA World Services has gone to great lengths to simply insure that, while our members are searching the internet for discounted rates (as you should), NAWS will not get penalized for failing to meet our commitments with the hotels. We are in a good position with the hotels and our rooms sales; given the economy, the hotels are very happy with NA and our performance so far.

Pre-Registration Merchandise-NEW DEADLINE!

The pre-registration merchandise deadline was set for 1 May! However, because of how we will be producing some of our merchandise we do not need as much lead time as we thought and can give you more time to buy any pre-registration merchandise you want. This is going to be completely unique merchandise and will not be for sale onsite. You can still get commemorative mugs, men's or women's t-shirts, and camp shirts by going to www.na.org/wcna.until.15 June! Don't miss out on this cool and unique merchandise.

Pre-Registration & Events Tickets

We are ready to announce that for WCNA 33 there will not be any additional need to buy tickets. Your registration will include all the events and activities at WCNA 33! The deadline for pre-registration is still 1-July, but you do not need to worry about spending more money on additional tickets and can hopefully use that money to buy merchandise, eat more tapas in Barcelona, and have an even better vacation. Much like the world conventions in Paris, France and Cartagena, Colombia, all the activities will be included and everyone will be able to celebrate "Love Without Borders" together every day and night on the Mediterranean Sea.

Changes to Pre-Registration Procedures!

Because of the registration software we are using this year, **everyone** who is pre-registered needs to bring a copy of their registration confirmation email. In previous years, as you may know, if you were registered as a guest of someone else, your badge was included in their packet. This year, each registrant must pick up his or her own registration; registrations are not held under other members' names.

Newcomer Badges

In line with the belief that we can only keep what we have by giving it away, we offer the opportunity for members to make a special donation to pay for the convention registration of newcomers with thirty or fewer days of cleantime. Newcomer registration packages are only available to members with thirty or fewer days clean who cannot pay all or part of the registration fee. In the spirit of the Seventh Tradition, we ask that each member requesting a package make some contribution toward its cost, if they are able. We do not offer indigent packages or any other "discounted" registration package to any members with more than thirty days clean. We extend our sincere thanks and gratitude to those who make it possible to share the gift of recovery through your donations, as the number of newcomer packages offered is contingent on the donations received.

Hours for Newcomer Badges

Wednesday, 19 August 17:00 to 18:00 h

Thursday, 20 August 12:00 h and 17:30 h Friday, 21 August 12:00 h and 17:30 h Saturday, 22 August 12:00 h and 17:30 h counter to ensure that you have received everything you should have. Once you leave the registration counter, corrections or adjustments cannot be made. If you ordered pre-registration merchandise, you will need to take your tickets to the pre-registration merchandise booth located next to the registration area. You will be given merchandise for each ticket you present. We are unable to change sizes or quantities from what is on your tickets since we based our quantities of sizes on your order.

Please remember that we are not responsible for the replacement of lost registration badges, and we will not give you another badge if yours is lost or stolen. There are no refunds on registrations.

Why Register?

You're registered, but what about your friends?

Chances are that if you are getting this newsletter you are already registered. Most of us who are already registered understand why registration is important. We hope the following information answers any questions you or your friends may have about why registration is important and why the cost of registration at the world convention seems higher than it is at most regional or area conventions.

Why is the cost of registration at WCNA higher than at other conventions?

We are committed to providing members the best and most memorable celebration of recovery, welcoming to all, while being responsible with fellowship funds. We realize that the registration fee for a world convention is higher than the registration fee for a local convention. Once the number of attendees becomes large enough to require use of a convention center, costs rise dramatically. If we have 5,000 people registered at WCNA 33, we will actually spend approximately €135.00 for each registrant, significantly more than the registration price.

Of the €135.00 per registrant, the rough break-down in expenses is as follows. We spend the largest portion, €71.00, on the convention center rental, set-up, tear-down, cleaning, security, and audio visual support. The next highest amount per registrant is €37.00 for registration and activities. This includes the distribution of information about WCNA ahead of the convention; the registration packets; dances every night; and rent, set up, and entertainment

at the Parc del Forum - all of which is included with your registration. Program is almost €10.00 per person and covers the cost of main speakers and translations equipment. Exhibits and administration cost a little over €10.00 per person, which includes artwork design and the various exhibits and signage you see at the convention. Our most reasonable expense is €7.00 per registrant for the fabulous support committee, who have worked tirelessly on your behalf and who reside in various locales throughout Spain. These members have diligently organized volunteers and are helping to provide a Spanish flavor for this event. Additionally, they have focused their efforts toward public relations activities in Barcelona and throughout Spain to bring attention and recognition to the convention and to help better carry the NA message of recovery in Spain, once we all leave and return home. The difference between the cost of €135.00 and what we charge for registration is largely covered by the sale of merchandise.

And why are we telling you all of this? Because we need your help!! It seems irresponsible to spend the fellowship's funds for those who choose not to register. We plan to enforce the requirement of a registration badge to attend any special events and dances. You can help us enforce this. Now, if you have a child under thirteen who needs a badge, please come to the Convention Information booth. We also do our best to accommodate those who are new, by providing hundreds of newcomer registrations for those with thirty or fewer days clean.

And perhaps the most important question... What's in it for me?

What comes with registration? Let us now tell you what your registration badge gives you — admission to everything planned at WCNA 33. This includes activities every single evening at both the Parc del Forum, with a wide variety of entertainment, as well as DJ dances each night at the Hotel AC Barcelona. You must wear your badge to enter and to be in any of these events. Anyone not wearing a badge, during special events covered by registration, will be asked to leave. All workshops and main meetings are open to all addicts and anyone interested in finding out more about Narcotics Anonymous.


At this convention, we are offering access to the merchandise room in Sala 112 of the convention center for pre-registrants only from 10:00 to 19:00 h Thursday. Only those with multi-colored badges will be allowed entrance to the store on Thursday. The merchandise room will be open for all others beginning at 10:00 h on Friday.



Please note that there is no day care for children. Parents need to monitor their children at all times. Children can attend events, but please keep in mind that events are geared toward members. Special kids' badges are available at Convention Information for those thirteen or under. All children over the age of thirteen must have their own registration badge to gain access to those events requiring a badge.

Additional Needs

Event facilities in Europe are not under the same legal obligations as those in the US, which may pose a challenge to some members with particular disabilities. The CCIB is equipped with elevators, but there are not necessarily ramps available to all convention areas. Scooters and wheelchairs will not be available onsite. If you or anyone you know has an additional need or requires special assistance, please contact us as soon as possible to discuss what accommodations, if any, can be made.



Smoking

In accordance with Barcelona practices and WSC policy, all meeting facilities will be nonsmoking throughout the convention. Smoking is only permitted outside the convention center. Cigarette receptacles will be available, and signs will be posted informing members that smoking is not permitted near the doors of the convention center. Please help us by smoking only in the designated smoking areas and being considerate of other members.

Please note that in Spain smoking in bars, cafés, and restaurants is almost always permitted. However, if in doubt, it is a good idea to check with staff.

Speaker Check-In


We ask that upon arrival at the convention, all main and workshop speakers check in as soon as possible at the program office in Sala 134.*

In Europe, room numbers beginning with "1" are located on the first floor up from ground level.

WCNA 33 Amor sin Fronteras Love Without Borders

WCNA 33, Amor sin Fronteras – Love without Borders, will be held at the Centre Convenciones Internacional Barcelona (CCIB) in the area called the Diagonal Forum right next to the Parc del Forum. The CCIB will be open to members beginning at 15:00 h on Wednesday, 19 August. The entrance doors for the convention center are located at the rear of the building closest to the sea. The Hotel AC Barcelona will host the dances and marathon meetings beginning on Wednesday evening. Evening musical entertainment and food will be offered at the Parc del Forum beginning Thursday after the main meeting. All other WCNA 33 activities will be held in the CCIB.

You can reach the CCIB by Metro (Maresme-Forum station on the yellow line), bus (lines number 7, 36, 41, 43, and 141) and Trambesos (Forum station). All these stops are located just a few minutes' walk from the CCIB. Taxis drivers know this area as the "Forum" or the "Diagonal Forum."



Marathon Meetings

Marathon meetings will be held throughout the convention. Unlike convention workshops and meetings, marathon meetings are closed meetings, (i.e., open only to addicts or those who think they may have a problem with drugs).

These meetings will be held at the Hotel AC Barcelona on the third floor in Sala 22@ beginning at 22:00 h on Wednesday and running continuously in one-hour slots until Sunday at 10:00 h. These meetings are all English-speaking.

Spanish-speaking marathon meetings will also be held, and a schedule will be available onsite. Limited space will be available by sign-up for other language groups who wish to hold marathon meetings. The location for these marathon meetings will also be on the third floor of the Hotel AC Barcelona.

Meetings, Workshops, and Forums

All main convention meetings and workshops will take place in the CCIB. Due to the number of people who are arriving early, we will have a speaker meeting on Wednesday night followed by a dance at the Hotel AC Barcelona. Our official Kick-Off meeting is Thursday night. Workshops and NAWS Forums will begin on Thursday at 10:00 h.

Climate in Barcelona

It is summer in Barcelona with average temperatures in August of about 29 Celsius or 84 Fahrenheit. It is sunny and beautiful with average humidity of about 70%.

Thunderstorms can pop up at any time from mid-August to mid-September but are usually brief. For those of you recovering from jet lag, do not forget to drink lots of water.

A Word of Caution

As in any big city, there are a lot of sites for tourists, and these types of sites also attract thieves and pickpockets. Be sure not to leave your handbags, cameras, or backpacks on chairs when you are eating in restaurants or when you are sitting in outdoor areas. Be sure to carry wallets in your front pockets. It is recommended that visitors make a color copy of passports to carry with them, so that their originals can be left in a secure location in their hotel rooms. It is a legal requirement in Spain for anyone over 14 years of age to carry photo ID at all times. The Diagonal Forum area near the convention center, like La Rambla in the center of town, is a popular spot for pickpockets and thieves, so please be extra careful.



Early Arrival in Barcelona

Because so many of our members are arriving in Barcelona early, there will be a hospitality desk in the lobby of the Hotel AC Barcelona (Paseo Taulat 278, 08019 Barcelona, Spain, Tel. 34.934.898.200) from 09:00 -14:00 h on Monday and Tuesday, 17-18 August. The Convention Visitors Bureau (CVB) of the Barcelona Tourism Office will be there to provide information about the city, restaurants, subway, and taxi information, and to sell tickets for local tours. There are a lot of places to see and things to do in and near Barcelona. The city is full of charming neighborhoods, with plenty of shopping, cafés, restaurants, tapas, fashion venues, museums, and parks. Barcelona is often called the "Spanish Paris," with its amazing buildings and the famous modernista architecture of Gaudí. Local members of the fellowship will be around to help direct people to meetings and simply to connect with other members. The CVB will have a hospitality desk at the convention center throughout the convention beginning on Wednesday, 19 August. NA Meetings

If you arrive early there are numerous meetings in the city. A schedule of the regular meetings is included at the end of this newsletter. Because the size of most of the meeting rooms is limited, local members have planned for English-speaking meetings to be held each night at the same location from Saturday, 15 August to Tuesday, 18 August. An English-speaking local helpline will also be available from 19:00 – 23:00 h daily at 34.638.888.296.

Events

Getting from the Airport to Your Hotel

Trains, buses, and taxis are available at the airport. Detailed information about these alternatives is included on page 9 of this newsletter. If you need to get Euros before you leave the airport, there is a currency exchange office right outside of the baggage claim area. If you are not a Spanish speaker, we strongly recommend that you bring a printed copy of your hotel information so you can provide it to the taxi driver or use it to get detailed directions if you are taking other transportation. Cab fares from the airport to most hotels in the city will range from €30-45.00. Most taxis drivers seem to know the area near the convention site as the "Forum" or "Diagonal Forum." There is a large shopping center by this name immediately across the street from the convention center and Hotel AC Barcelona.

Merchandise and Onsite Literature Sales

Merchandise and literature sales will both be located in Sala 112.* Only those who are pre-registered will be admitted on Thursday. The area will open to all beginning Friday morning. Alternative merchandise will be located in the same room.



Getting to the CCIB or the City Center from the Airport

El Prat airport is located 13 kilometres southeast from Barcelona and 20 kilometres from the CCIB.

Train (RENFE)

The train service between the airport and the city center (Paseo de Gracia) is covered from 06:00 to 22:29 h (direction Barcelona) from 05:20 and 22:50 h (direction airport) There is one train every 30 minutes and the travel time is 25 minutes.

From the train station, Paseo de Gracia, it is easy to connect with the yellow line (4 line) of the Metro. The closest station to the CCIB is Maresme-Forum, Tel. 34.902.240.202.

Express Bus (Aerobús)

The bus service between the airport and the city center (Plaza Cataluña) is covered from 06:00 to 01:00 h on working days and from 6:30 to 1:00 h during the weekends (direction Barcelona), from 05:30 to 00:15 h on working days, and from 06:00 to 00:30 h during the weekends (direction airport). There is one bus every 8 minutes and the travel time is 30 minutes.

Next to Plaza Cataluña, you can take the yellow line (line 4) of the Metro at the Urquinaona station. The closest station to the CCIB is Maresme-Forum, Tel. 34.906.427.017.

Taxi

The journey to the CCIB takes about 20 minutes. Fees change according to the time of day.

T1 Nightime fees: working days from 21:00 to 07:00 h and weekends and bank holidays from 00:01 to 24:00 h

T2 Daytime fees: from 07:00 to 21:00 h

There is an additional cost for entry/exit from the airport and for carrying luggage.

Rent-a-Car

The C-31 motorway connects the airport with Barcelona. The easiest way to get into the city is by the Gran Via or Avenida Diagonal, which are the most direct accesses to the city center, or by Ronda de Dalt and Ronda del Litoral, which are the city ringroads.

The most direct way to reach the CCIB is by the Ronda Litoral (exit 24). It takes about 30 minutes depending on the traffic.

If you are going to the CCIB from the city center by car, the best option is to take the Avenida Diagonal to its end.





Getting from Your Hotel to the Convention Center

There is no shuttle service provided by NAWS for WCNA 33. A limited number of hotels are within walking distance of the convention center. Many of the other hotels are located in the center of Barcelona, whilst the convention center is considered to be in the "suburbs" of the city, connected to a shopping mall, in a predominately residential part of town that has just recently been renovated. The trip from the CCIB to the center of town is about a 20 minute underground train ride (the L4 Metro line) or a €10 taxi ride that takes about 10-15 minutes. Trains and buses run from the CCIB to the heart of Barcelona, and multiple-trip passes are available for about €7 and up.







If you are looking for a "Barcelona experience," you may prefer to stay at one of the hotels in the center of town, close to some of the best shopping, cortados (coffee), restaurants, tapas, fashion venues, museums, and parks in Europe—all within the backdrop of the "Spanish Paris," with its amazing buildings and the famous architecture of Gaudi! The hotels in this part of town are within walking distance of the world-famous La Rambla. Trains and buses run from the CCIB to the heart of Barcelona 24/7 during the convention, and multiple-trip passes are available for about €7 and up. The CCIB is considered to be in the "suburbs" of Barcelona, connected to a shopping mall, but surrounded predominately by condos in a part of town that has just recently been renovated. While it is very nice and new, many members looking for a European vacation will prefer to stay in the heart of Barcelona and go to the CCIB for convention events.

AC Barcelona is the headquarters hotel. We are currently planning on having all dances and marathons meetings at the AC, which is connected to the convention center.

Planning for Your European World Convention

You will find that some things will be very different from a typical world convention held in North America. Please pay close attention to this brochure and other convention information to help you plan your successful world convention. Some of the unique qualities of a convention in Europe (besides all the good food and beautiful people) are:

Shuttle Services will not be provided to and from WCNA hotels. All hotels are within walking distance of either the convention center or the Metro Line that goes to the convention center.


ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) is an American policy, not enforced in the European Union. As a result, many facilities and locations will not be as accessible as in the US. In Europe, elevators are small and sidewalks are not as accommodating for wheelchairs or scooters. Many of the access-related services NAWS has provided at past world conventions will not be provided in Barcelona. Consequently, there will not be a formal ADA plan in place for WCNA 33. Please note these differences so that you may plan accordingly. Available public transportation may include underground trains, buses, or taxis. Due to the cost and location of the convention, NAWS will not be providing scooters at WCNA 33. If you decide that Barcelona may be too much of a challenge, remember that WCNA 34 will be back in San Diego, California, in 2011. If it is important for you to be at a hotel close to the convention center due to additional needs (such as aided or limited mobility), please make your reservation as soon as possible. The WCNA 33 housing bureau in Barcelona is not prepared or able to provide preferential treatment or to hold a block of rooms at "walking distance" hotels for those with disabilities.

I relocated to Wisconsin in 1990 and served there as RSR/A for the Wisconsin region beginning in 1991.1 attended four WSC's as the RSR/A for that region. In 1996 I was selected to serve on the Transition Group which developed the plan for restructuring NA World Services to its current form. In 1998 I was elected to the World Board in its first cycle. In 2000 I was re-elected to a six year term, which will expire at WSC 2006.

Chuck G., Agoura Hills, CA

Chuck has been a member of NA since 1970. He has held many and varied service positions through the years. Jimmy K. was Chuck's sponsor for 13 years. Chuck was involved with the World Service Office till the mid 1980s including serving as Secretary, Treasurer, and President. At one time he was on the Board of Trustees. Chuck served as World Service Conference Chair and Vice-Chair in the early 1980s.

Dorine P., Americus, GA

Donne has been clean since October 11. 1972, where she did so in Washington, DC. Like many other early recovering addicts. she started attending meetings in AA, before hearing about Narcotics Anonymous. Her first NA meeting was in a "dimly lit room" at the VA Hospital, where she picked up The Little White Pamphlet and liked what she read. She called the phone number for the Central Office to get more information about this new program and reached Jimmy K., who promptly sent her a Meeting Starter Kit Very soon after that Dorine started the first NA meeting outside of the hospital at the Court House. and among those first ten people there was Anthony E., now Director of The WSO. Shortly thereafter she started countless other new meetings, including one at All Saints Church and All Souls Churchmeetings still running today Dorine called Jimmy K. nearly every day (she held a

government job and used their phone!")
She has sponsored many many recovering addicts all over the country and among them was NA member Tina T, who was responsible for starting Narcotics Anonymous Meetings in the Gay and Lesbian Community, in the greater DC area. Dorine still attends meetings regularly in Americus, and continues to serve as a sponsor today.

Fawn F., Chevy Chase, MD

Fawn got clean in the San Fernando Valley in 1978. She got involved in NA service right away serving as secretary for the San Fernando Valley Area and the Southern California Region. She claims her most rewarding experience was volunteering at the World Service Office when it was in Jimmy Ks house. In 1979 she was elected to serve as the Secretary to the World Service Conference and again in 1980. She continued to volunteer at the World Service Office and became one of the volunteer secretaries at the office with Betty K., assisting whenever she could. In 1981 Fawn was elected as Secretary to the World Service Office Board of Directors Inc. Jimmy resigned from the Board of Trustees in 1981. Shortly thereafter, Fawn had no further interest whatsoever in serving for any of the committees seated at the Conference that year as she questioned the integrity of the Board of Trustees actions. She relocated to the East Coast in 1982. She settled in the Washington DC/Maryland area. Today she raises three wonderful children, and remains active in

Gary has been a member of NA since 1979. He helped start the first NA meeting in Ohio, and many more in Ohio, Michigan, and West Virginia. Gary was involved in the writing of the Basic Text. He was World H&i Vice-Chair in 1982 and chaired the workshop that developed our first H&I Handbook. Gary continues to be involved in service as he is the Florida Regional Convention Board President since 1998. He is the chair

of the committee that is writing the History of NA in Florida book.

Gene H., Medford, OR

Gene H started in NA on March 21, 1962 when there were only two meetings and about a dozen members. The two meetings were at Rhodes and Moorepark in Studio City and the other at Bill and Zona's in Burbank. He was sponsored by Paul Smart and his personal friend Jimmy Kinnon. Jimmy turned over all literature and the answering service to Gene and his wife Tilly as well as the chairmanship of the Friday night Mother Group at Rhodes and Moorepark, in late 1962. Tilly was bombarded with calls from the desperate spouses of addicts at all hours of the night, which she handled quite well, along with raising their six children. Gene was transferred to Southern Oregon in late 1974, bringing NA to that area. He chaired the 2nd Pacific Northwest NA Conference in 1979. He also served on the Regional Service Committee and visited James Drinkwater to encourage NA in Canada. Gene's story. The Vicious Circle, first appeared in the original White Pamphlet published in 1962. It is now on page 219 of the Basic Text.

Grover N., Lost City, OK

Grover got clean in 1986. He served as Alabama/Northwest Florida Regional History Committee chair and co-chair 1989-91. He co-founded na-historyorg, is active at nawol org, and is co-author of Tradition Wars Patthuray To Peace.

Jack W., Tacoma, WA

Jack has been continuously clean since 1971. He has held many Group, Area, and Regional positions over the years including GSR, Treasurer, Secretary, Area Chair and Vice-Chair, and Regional Convention Committee positions. Jack has been involved in H&I, PI, and various literature review committees.

Jim got clean in NA in 1979. He was active on the World Literature Committee from 1980 to 1984 and helped with the Basic Text. Jim was the first editor of the NA Way magazine, contributed to early H&I literature, and Information Pamphlets. Jim helped Regional Service Committees start in Ohio, Tri-State, and Michigan. He was on the World Policy Committee in 1982. Jim continues to be active in his NA homegroup.

Maryjane started attending NA in 1963. She was among the first women attending NA in the early 1960s when our fellowship began anew She participated in writing the Little White Pamphlet. Maryjane started the Glendale meeting with Netta in 1963. She held various service positions in early NA including H&I, participated in Twelfth Step calls. Helpline, and Group Secretary. Maryjane was involved in starting up the first drug treatment centers in California using the NA 12 Steps.

Mel H., Whittier, CA

Mel got clean in prison in CA in 1968. Later on Mel carried an H&I meeting back to that same institution. Around 1969 Mel helped start five NA meetings, these were the sixth through tenth NA meetings in the Los Angeles area. He served as GSO Chairman around 1969 or 1970. Mel conceived of and organized the First World Convention in 1971. He was on the Board of Trustees 1975-79.

Sally E., Toronto, CA

Sally has been clean since September I, 1969, Some of her service positions throughout the years include: World Service Board of Trustees 1997; re-elected in 1984 for a total of nine years; Vice-Chair one year; Chair for two years; World Service Office Board of Directors two years; World Literature Committee four years; Basic Text. Tradition Section; NA Way, Editorial Board three years; and collaborated for two years on a Step & Tradition book that has yet to be published.

Steve M., New Windsor, MD

Steve has been clean since 1982 after having first gotten clean in prison in 1980. In 1982 Steve began his involvement in H&l. He helped start the first meetings in Annapolis, Maryland as well as starting the Bay Area in 1983. Steve has held positions on the Group and Area levels. He has been Regional Chair, Vice-Chair, H&l Chair, and served on several other Regional committees. Steve was active on the World level for five years as RSR and RCM. He was on the World H&l Committee. Steve was on the World Literature Committee when The Narcotics Anonymous Step Working Guide was written.

Sylvia, San Francisco, CA

Sylvia got clean in May of 1962. As far as anyone knows Sylvia has more clean time than any other woman in NA. When Sylvia started attending NA there were only three meetings. Sylvia started NA in Berkeley. California around 1966 and helped NA spread throughout the San Francisco Bay area.

Terry B., Pittsburgh, PA

Terry has been a member of our fellowship since 1982. He was on a "Select Committee on the Service Structure" that produced the Twelve Concepts and several service manuals. Terry was somewhat involved in the writing of "It Works: How and Why." He incorporated the Pittsburgh Service Office and wrote most of the bylaws.

Terry R., Heber, UT

Terry got clean in 1979. He started NA in New York City during 1981. Terry was involved in World H&I for four years: he has been active in H&I having served in many positions. During Terry's early recovery Jimmy K. was his friend and sponsor. Currently Terry is a Regional Delegate in Utah.

I got clean in 1982—February 9! I served in all group and area positions! I served the Carolina Region as PI Chair and AD. I was a WSCPI pool member WSCPI Vice Chair, WSCPI Chair, Served on the Board of Trustees for one year! The last year they were in existence. I have served on the WB for the last five years.
