

# DANIEL L. CARLSEN DIES

## Former Drug Addict Founded Narcotics Anonymous in '50

Daniel L. Carlsen, founder of Narcotics Anonymous, died Sunday at Montefiore Hospital, the Bronx, after a long illness. He was 50 years old.

Mr. Carlsen founded Narcotics Anonymous in 1950 after having spent nine years in hospitals and prisons for narcotic addiction. He had been a patient at the United States Public Health Service Hospital in Lexington, Ky., eight times since he became an addict at the age of 16.

The group was formed to help newly treated sufferers to continue their abstinence by introducing them to a dedicated way of life in which they passed on the benefits of their experience to other sufferers.

Mr. Carlsen was also executive director of the National Advisory Council on Narcotics, an educational group.

MRS. SARAH STARR, A CIVIC LEADER, 82

Head of the Woman's Medical College of Pennsylvania From '21 to '41 Dies

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 20—Mrs. Sarah Logan Wister Starr, president of the Woman's Medical College of Pennsylvania from 1921 to 1941, died Saturday in Rockville, Md. She was 82 years old.

Mrs. Starr, a descendant of a prominent Colonial family, was the widow of James Starr, a mining official.

The Medical College, founded in 1850, was moved to its present site in the Falls of the Schuylkill section here in 1929. The opening of the new quarters was one of the major accomplishments of her service.

For many years Mrs. Starr was president of the Pennsylvania Society of Colonial Dames. At her death, she was president of the Women's Permanent Emergency Association of Germantown, of which her grandmother was a founder.

Mrs. Starr also had been active in the Swedish Colonial Society and the American Swedish Historical Foundation. In 1937 she went to Sweden as a member of the Pennsylvania Tercentenary Commission and later was honored by Sweden.

She was an associate trustee of the Board of Libraries at the University of Pennsylvania, a past chairman of the Germantown Branch of the Civic Club and had received honorary degrees from Ursinus College in 1933 and from the University of Pennsylvania in 1941.

At Chester, N. S., where members of her family have spent their summers since 1874, Mrs. Starr founded the Zee Valley Library.
