Some There Is Little Hope; s The Life Of 'Old Steve'

Take, Too The Case Of 'The Hype'; He Raised And Educated Eight Children Well, But He Has Been A 13-Timer For Cure

Living is nothing more than a frightening uncertainty to an anxious yet pleasant man carrying a concealed haunted for more than 20 years by the hypnotic specter of drug addiction.

Only behind the walls of the U. S. Public Health Service hospital her

Only behind the walls of the U.S. Public Health Service hospital here does he find a retreat, if not a fortification against his self-destruction.

By all the standards of normal living he is dead—and buried in a tomb of obscurity he built, stone by stone, himself.

He is far apart from any interest except that which he invests in the dim prospect of M his own real fate.

This man, a slave rather than master of powdered junk, exists as a human individual although he patterns well the characteristics of the composite addict.

Tragically alone, he is the lord of nothing. His own life is beyond his management. He has lost his will, his nerve and even the pleasure of being alive.

He is a case history here, one of the thousands in the annals of the public health service.

A Repeat Patient

There is, however, one measure of respect he merits. He, too, will wear the cloak of anonymity because he is a voluntary patient at the hospital, which is more like a home to him than anything he has



January, 1937. He remained eight days before he was discharged as a detriment to the station, and even on his second admission his attitude was one of indifference toward the institution and treat-ment. Lately, he has been more co-operative.

A self-condemnatory has characterized Old Steve, who is inclined to regard himself and his efforts as worthless and to think of himself as a nuisance. Emotionally immature, he has led a life of irresponsibility and fail-

He exists in no stable environment. He has no real home. Out-side of confinement, he feels in-secure, and he has experienced very early relapses after each

His physical condition is actively growing worse and his symptoms. including anxiety, have progressed accordingly. He says his jitters have become vorse.

Once A Police Chief

Born on a farm, he once served
as a police chief, but in the last
10 years he has had no employment. He has income from inherited property, apparently.
Old Steve once injured himself
seriously in a suicide attempt. Fear
of him led his wife to abandon
him through divorce.

His prognosis, or outlook, is just a out hopeless, although the hospital does not withdraw its aid until death finally overtakes a man.

admitting: "Of course I had to get or morphine again. I did not have to, but I did, I'm ashamed to say." He underscored the word "ashamed."

After outlining his views on a re-admission, he vowed:

"I would give anything on earth if I was off morphine. I would be the happiest man in the world if I was off.

But he will never be happy. Similar to the case of Old Steve is the history of another chronic addict who, for broad identifica-tion, may be called The Hype. But

there is one striking difference.

The Hype, divorced by dhe wife and separated by death from another, raised eight children and educated them well. All are at least moderately successful in business and in their personal lives.

He now has no dependents.

Like Old Steve, he maintains that he received several injections of narcotics by his physician to stop drinking, and gradually developed a habit of using pare-

goric and morphine.

He has a record of severe alcoholism and, later, drug addiction dating back to 1936.

Hostile And Depressed

A 67-year-old onetime farmer, The Hype is somewhat retiring in nanner, speaks softly and displays an average or above average in-telligence, but he sometimes be-comes hostile and depressed.

In more recent years, The Hype, now in his 13th visit within the walls of Narco, has been using morphine and nembutal.

Ill several times and seriously injured once, he used to worry about his physical condition and drug addiction, but he has eased his concern. Not too many years ago he suffered a broken neck and was confined in a cast for 16 months.

But trouble, aside from raising a family of eight, has constantly taunted The Hype. Even the good

intentions of his sons backfired.
Following one of his releases from the hospital, the sons the sons launched a movement to keep him away from drugs. To counter his narcotic addiction, they offered him whisky, and in the whirl of confusion which had originally beset him, he resumed a strong alcoholic habit in a vicious cycle of narcotics vs. alcohol vs. nar-cotics, etc.

Besides his Lexington ventures, The Hype has been a five-time patient at the Fort Worth hospital. For him, too, there is little real

The Hype knows his trouble. In 1949, three days after leaving the hospital here, he suffered three broken fingers in an automobile

accident and relapsed to drugs. He journeyed back to Narco, saying he knew he should return before he became "addicted."
