Referral Sources and Admission Procedure: Applicants prepare
"Application for Voluntary Admission."
Completed form signed by applicant and
mailed to Medical Officer in Charge, Public
Health Service Hospital, Lexington, Kentucky.
Applications may be obtained from Office of
Narcotics Coordinator, 325 Broadway, New
York 7, N.Y. or by writing to Box 2000,
Lexington, Ky. Applicant will receive letter
of authorization stipulating when to report
to hospital for admission. There is a waiting
list. Length of stay indefinite

Eligibility: Male addicts over 21. New York State residence.

Services: In-patient detoxification, medical, psychiatric, counseling, referral, social, vocational training, referral for job placement, recreational, religious and informational.

Referral Sources and Admission Procedure: Contact through Manhattan State Hospital, Miss Gallo, EN. 9-0500, Ext. 508. Patients stay 30 days minimum. There is a waiting list, with waiting period about 10 days. In emergencies, contact Central Islip Hospital directly.

Fee: None if medically indigent.

Staff: Psychiatrists, occupational and vocational Therapists, social workers, psychologist.

Referral Sources and Admission Procedure: Voluntary application from all boroughs, referrals from all accredited community agencies. Apply to Registration Bureau in Mental Hygiene Clinic, 8-10 A.M., 12-2 P.M. daily. After registration, applicant is evaluated by clinic staff. Average waiting period between application and admission is 2-3 weeks. Average length of stay for in-patients is one month (2 weeks on withdrawal, 2 weeks convalescence).

There is a waiting period except in emergencies.
