In 1949 an addict named Danny Carlsen started a self-help group in New York City. He called it Narcotics Anonymous.

In the next six years Danny started other meetings. There were articles about his movement in the *New York Times*, *Newsweek*, & the *Saturday Evening Post*.

In 1956 Daniel Carlsen died an early death but his vision did not die with him.

DANIEL L. CARLSEN DIES

Former Drug Addict Founded Narcotics Anonymous in '50

Daniel L. Carlsen, founder of Narcotics Anonymous, died Sunday at Montefiore Hospital, the Bronx, after a long illness. He was 50 years old.

Mr. Carlsen founded Narcotics Anonymous in 1950 after having spent nine years in hospitals and prisons for narcotic addiction. He had been a patient at the United States Public Health Service Hospital in Lexington, Ky, eight times since he became an addict at the age of 16.

The group was formed to help newly treated sufferers to continue their abstinence by introducing them to a dedicated way of life in which they passed on the benefits of their experience to other sufferers.




