




# SERVICE SYSTEM PROJECT

## Origin of project

- Ongoing challenges at local levels
- IDTs have helped identify challenges, but more needed to be done
- Current structure developed years ago
- World services restructured; local services did not



# SERVICE SYSTEM PROJECT




## Project adopted at WSC 2008

- Provide framed options and recommendations for discussion by the conference and the fellowship


# SERVICE SYSTEM PROJECT

- How can we build a system\* of service within NA that is driven by unity of purpose, and that allows for flexibility in meeting the diverse service needs and goals of our NA communities?


# SERVICE SYSTEM PROJECT




## Foundational Principles


- Purpose-driven

The colors on this map correspond to different regions and each push pin represents a zip code where a group exists.




