WHAT IS THE NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS PROGRAM?

N.A. is a non-profit fellowship or society of men and women for whom drugs had become a major problem. We are recovered addicts who meet regularly to help each other to stay clean. This is a program of complete abstinence from all drugs. There is only "One" requirement for membership, the honest desire to stop using. There are no musts in N.A. but we suggest that you keep an open mind and give yourself a break. Our program is a set of principles, written so simply, lives. The most important thing about them is that "They Work".

WHO IS AN ADDICT?

Most of us do not have to think twice about this question. WE KNOW. Our whole life and thinking is centered in drugs in one form or another, the getting and using and finding ways and means to get more. We use to live and live to use. Very simply an addict is a man or women whose life is controlled by drugs. We are people in the grip of a continuing and progressive illness whose ends are always the same, jails, institutions and death.

THE 12 TRADITIONS OF N.A.

THE 12 STEPS OF N.A.

1. We admitted that we were powerless over our addiction — that our lives had become unmanageable. 2. We came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity. 3. We made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him. 4. We made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves. 5. We admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs. 6. We were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character. 7. We humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings. 8. We made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all. 9. We made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others. 10. We continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it. 11. We sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for the knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out. 12. Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to addicts and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

1—Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon N.A. unity. 2—For our group purposes there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern. 3—The only requirement for N.A. membership is a desire to stop using. 4—Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or N.A. as a whole. 5—Each group has but one primary purpose—to carry its message to the addict who still suffers. 6—An N.A. group ought never endorse, finance, or lend the N.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property or prestige divert us from our primary purpose. 7—Every N.A. group ought to be fully self supporting, declining outside contributions. 8—Narcotics Anonymous should remain forever non-professional, but our service centers may employ special workers. 9—N.A., as such, ought never to be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve. 10—Narcotics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the N.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy. 11—Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio and films. 12—Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

Tell yourself—

JUST FOR TODAY my thoughts will be on my recovery, living and enjoying life without the use of drugs.

JUST FOR TODAY I will have faith in someone in N.A. who believes in me and wants to help me in my recovery.

JUST FOR TODAY I will have a program. I will try to follow it to the best of my ability.

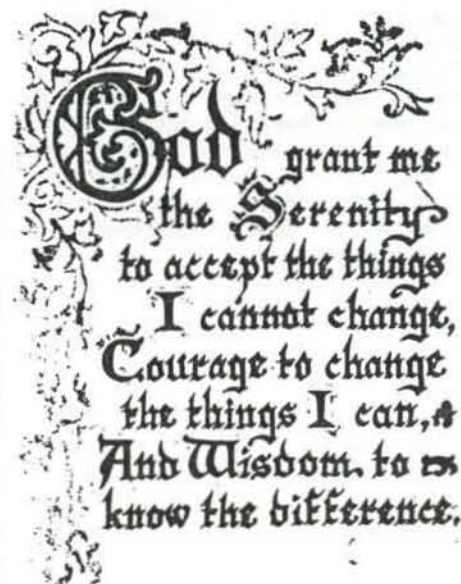
JUST FOR TODAY through N.A. I will try to get a better perspective on my life.

Anyone may join us regardless of age, race, color, creed, religion or lack of religion.

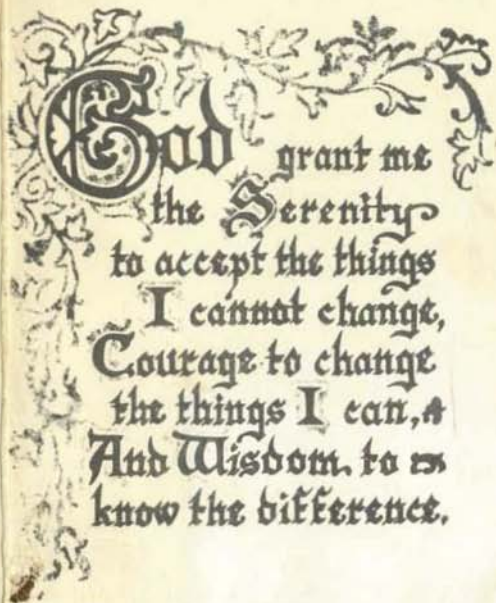
