

## HISTORY OF OXFORD CIRCLE GROUP OF NA

In 1971, The Oxford Circle Group of NA originally started as The Boulevard Group of NA by four addicts seeking a meeting on Friday night. Its first meeting was held at the First Christian Church of Christ at 10th and Roosevelt Blvd. September 1974 Brian T. said the group decided to split the meeting in two 1-meeting was a Step Meeting and the other a Speaker Discussion. The group held several 50/50 drawings at this location. One of the dates was September 19, 1975. On May 4, 1975 at the Inter Group Meeting Eileen G. was looking for a new meeting place. The group remained at 10th & Blvd. until 1975, and then it moved July 1975 to 13th and Ruscomb Street at Muhlenberg Lutheran Church it was called the Logan Group of NA. This meeting was the third NA meeting in Philadelphia.

In 1976 there were 16 meetings held in Pennsylvania and it was the second largest state to have NA meetings. The group grew and moved to its current location in April of 1976 and changed its name to the Oxford Circle Group of NA. Meetings were held on Friday evenings at 8:30. at Saint Martins Church Oxford Ave. & Roosevelt Blvd. The Oxford Circle Group of NA is the longest on going meeting in Philadelphia.

During the new century, the group had changed and the majority of the original members moved on and sought to help other groups to grow within the area. The group had struggle with change, but remain to keep the doors open.

Today the group has grown with new members who continue to strive and preserve to provide an atmosphere of recovery for any addict seeking recovery.
